The <u>Thrive Food Systems Fund</u> is a multi-donor pooled fund with a mission to accelerate the end of global factory farming and create just, healthy, plant-based food systems.

The Thrive Food Systems Fund offers grants to advocates who are reconceptualizing what it means to feed the world. We currently grant over 70 countries and 6 continents and growing, and we use equitable funding approaches.

## **About the Regional Funding Steering Committees**

What drives impact of the Thrive Food Systems Fund is its alliance of expert regional steering committees. This is an unpaid voluntary opportunity.

Regional Funding Steering Committees impart expertise and lived experience in local food systems and in-depth access to local advocate networks.

By utilizing regional experts and networks, Thrive ensures funding allocation is regionally effective and culturally appropriate, and that we avoid risk of Western colonialism or inequitable funding practices.

### Goals

- Collaboratively ascertain effective regional funding priorities
- Collaboratively ascertain effective regional capacity-building and/or movement-building projects
- Expand regional networks of food systems vegan advocates and potential grantees
- Expand the interest of plant-based food systems advocacy into novel networks
- Expand network of food systems funders to contribute to the Fund
- As desired, committee members may collaborate with Thrive Food Systems Fund partner acquisition efforts. (This might look like joining a donor meeting, speaking about the fund at a conference, being an ambassador for the fund within your network, or similar.)

### Time Commitment

- Up to 25 hours per year, with more time welcomed.
- Commitments include: potentially 2-4 virtual committee meetings, ad hoc meetings and email discussions, expanding potential grantee pool, potentially vetting grant applicants, potentially holding grantee consultation calls, being an ambassador for Thrive Philanthropy within your network.
- Plus extra time to build relationships and have fun!

I am a Thrive grant recipient or plan to apply for a Thrive grant. Can I still apply to the committee?

- **Yes!** Current, past, or future grant applicants are welcome to apply. Since we are recruiting individuals with significant regional expertise and lived experience, we expect to have grantees on the committee and highly value your knowledge.
  - Your likelihood of receiving a grant is not impacted, positively or negatively, by being on the committee and you will be recused from any grant proposal review.
