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Course Description, Grade 6, The World: This course covers major topics in ancient, medieval, and early modern world history from the beginning of civilization to the age of exploration. The course examines how geography shapes the societies and the cultures of Southwest Asia (The Middle East), South Asia, East Asia, Africa, the Americas, and Europe as well as how political, social, and economic systems develop and change over time. Students will explore the spread of civilizations and how the encounters and interactions between them influenced the development of human society.
