Designing A Path for Your Needs

To help you achieve your accessibility and inclusion goals, I offer a range of services that are always tailored to your organization's unique needs. From single-event public speaking engagements that change hearts and minds, to in-depth consulting projects engaging community members in co-creating your future, we will land on a proposal that meets your needs on the path that only you can take. The examples below illustrate the types of support available, but it's only the beginning. My "Perspectives-First" Approach

My approach to accessibility is about more than ticking off checklists and sharing technical best practices. Those are important, and our work will include them, but I focus on building a skill I call "access thinking" (the practice of considering the fullness of human abilities and disabilities in everyday choices), and helping your organization cultivate a "culture of access" (embedding access thinking into a group's habitual way of working). Policies will be shifted, requirements will be revised, but real change comes from connection, and I'm here to help you build something that lasts.
