What important theological ideas or key terms appear in this passage?
What does it teach about God—His character, actions, purposes, and relationship with humanity?

4. Human Response & Condition

What does this passage reveal about human nature?
What examples of faith, sin, obedience, fear, struggle, or response to God are present?

5. Life Application

What is God inviting or calling us to believe, change, resist, practice, or trust because of this passage?
How can these truths be faithfully lived out in today's world?
