 - "Believe did not originally mean believing a set of doctrines or teachings; in both Greek and Latin its roots mean "to give one's heart to". The "heart" is the self at its deepest level. Believing, therefore, does not consist of

giving one's mental assent to something, but involves a much deeper level of one's self."

 There are three "macro-stories" in the Bible: the exodus, the exile and the priesthood. Each has their own unique problem (oppression, exile and sin) and their own unique solution (freedom, homecoming and acceptance).

The story that has dominated Western Christianity for centuries is the priesthood. That's fine for people marred by sin, but what of the oppressed and exiled?

The sin story says, "I have wronged another", but what of those who have been wronged? It is true, but not complete. It is the gospel for a powerful people. At best, it does not speak to a powerless people. At worst, it oppresses them.
