

### FINDING JUNIE KIM



## THE MANY MASKS OF ANDY ZHOU



## NEVERMOOR





## THE MISCALCULATIONS OF LIGHTNING GIRL



## **THE LAST MAPMAKER**



When Sai learns that the ship might be heading for the fabled Sunderlands—a land of dragons, dangers, and riches beyond imagining—she must weigh the cost of her dreams. Vivid, suspenseful, and thought-provoking, this tale of identity and integrity is as beautiful and intricate as the maps of old.


## **THE EXPLORER**

## SCYTHE



## JENNIFER CHAN IS NOT ALONE


