- Centennial was approved to host an art installation from the **Besharat Gallery and their Faces of Innocence** project.
- The Counseling Department organized CA's annual Career Day event for scholars on 4/18

Updates:

- TNTP Cultural Insight Survey launched 4/19, Insight gathers teacher feedback on critical instructional leadership practices and gives leaders the actionable information they need to increase teacher retention and improve student learning. This survey administration will serve as baseline data; Centennial will participate in the survey bi-annually (fall and spring).
- Relay Partnership update: Academic Leaders will attend full-day **Get Better Faster Training**, as a precursor to our summer intensive with Relay. The professional development will support our work with coaching for the 23-24 school year.

- After a rigorous process that included: Video Interview, Data presentation, School Tour, Student panel, Parent panel, and time with the HOS we are very close to officially announcing the Assistant Principal for grades 6-8 for the 23-24 school year.
