## 5. AOCB

a. Cycling Scotland Conference (10<sup>th</sup> September). Agreed that the DCF will have a stand at an early bird volunteer rate of £100, plus an additional delegate pass for £85. Total cost will be £185.

## Appendix A – DCF meeting with Steven Rome and James Mullen

DCF had a positive meeting with Steven Rome and James Mullen with the following highlights:

1. DCF welcomed the news that DCC had been awarded funding for all the applied for active travel projects from Transport Scotland. James Mullen to send DCF details after Transport Scotland make an official announcement.
2. DCC were awarded the funding early as they had tenders which had an end date and were pleased that Transport Scotland were able to accommodate them.
3. The active freeway design for Lochee RD/Arbroath RD (now sustainable transport corridor proposals) have been awarded to SWECO. DCF commented that SWECO's last involvement had caused more harm than good to the active travel proposals. DCC agreed that mistakes had been made including letting an inexperienced Engineer attend a meeting with Stobswell forum by himself as there were no experienced staff from DCC or SWECO available to go with him. DCF did not buy that it was the Engineer to blame but poor management and lack of resources. James made assurances that SWECO were a big organisation, and this contract would be well resourced with the appropriate level of skill and experience. DCF raised the issue that while the Lochee Road Conceptual design was optimal the bidirectional path design for the Arbroath Road would struggle with junctions. James said the bidirectional design was staying and there would be good solutions for the junctions.
4. The new MacDonald drive through on the green circular / NCN77 was discussed. DCF asked that DCC put in a crossing, or the shared path crossing would become dangerous - similar to what happened at Tom Johnston Road where the green circular is not safe for vulnerable users. James said DCC were speaking to Sustrans about a possible crossing and would get back to DCF.
5. DCF discussed the Green Circular at Tom Johnston Road being challenging to cross and while James agreed but said DCC would not be addressing the problem as it was too difficult and were looking at options to put the Green Circular route over to the west side of Balgillo road sometime in the future.
6. James went through a list of smaller active travel projects which are welcome and progressing with funding.
7. James also gave an update on the new transport Hub which DCF have said would be pointless without delivering the active freeways.
8. James mentioned that DCC were being encouraged to do more consultation on active travel projects. I believe DCC doesn't get that they will have to do the work/surveys/engagement to demonstrate to business/ shop owners/community groups that the active freeways will help address transport poverty and be an economic as well as public health and environment benefit. If they don't do this active travel will always be regarded in Dundee as a leisure activity and not the mass transport option, it could be. Glasgow and Edinburgh understand this, but Dundee has yet to deliver infrastructure that reflects the sustainable transport hierarchy.
