The Law Center has an abundance of leaders on our team, and we've been intentional about empowering every staff member to do things you might associate with an Executive Director. Almost everyone initiates and carries out projects, fundraises, writes grants, does operational work, presents to the public, writes, engages in network-building, participates in governance, and makes commitments on behalf of the organization. We long had an Executive Director, believing that the outside world expected us to emulate the typical structures of the nonprofit sector. But the title "Executive Director" tends to be imbued with power, whether we want it to be or not, and we realized that this disrupts our intention to meaningfully spread power. If you came looking for an Executive Director, here are some tips:

- Who should sign official documents? All our staff make commitments on behalf of the
 organization pertaining to the areas of work they engage in, and they are empowered to

- Is it that you want to give us a grant or major donation? Yay! Normally, people want to
 talk to an Executive Director, but our suggestion is to start by emailing Elizabeth Burnett

 CC any staff whose work you find particularly inspiring. They will be excited to hear from
 you.
