- 4. Concur (12) To be of the same opinion; agree--*I concur with the idea that we should start high school at 8:30 rather than 7:30*
- 5. Glean (12) To gather information or material bit by bit--Read these instructions for putting together the tricycle and summarize for me
- 6. Affinity (19) A natural attraction, liking, or feeling of kinship--*I feel an affinity for small mammals and that's why I want to become a vet*
- 7. Venerated (22) Worthy of adoration or reverence--*In Chinese culture old age is venerated; unfortunately, in the U.S. elderly people aren't*
- 8. Neophyte (29) A beginner; A recent convert to a belief; a proselyte--She's pretty darned good at shooting the three for a neophyte ball player
- 9. Draconian (43) Exceedingly harsh; very severe--Locking Harry in the "room under the stairs" was a draconian punishment for zapping Dudley with a spell. "Draconian measures"
- 10. Cajole (47) To urge with gentle and repeated appeals or flattery--*Parents often try to cajole their kids into eating vegetables* (to little avail)
