Takeaways

- Many police surveillance tools are integrated in a software called Axon including Skydio, Starchase, Fusus and more.
- Suburban police departments seem to be informally collaborating around Oak Brook PD
- Emergent technologies may have unintended benefits as well as ill-effects
- Oak Brook PD offers more information about Starchase itself than hard data concerning their use of it.

Follow-Up Questions & Observations

- What is the exact number of Starchase deployments by Oak Brook PD, and what is their approximate annual expenditure on the technology?
- Sargent Buenrostro referred to transparency in drone usage, including logging flight paths. How could a civilian access this information? How much of it is actually saved?
- Is there any oversight and review of this data once it is logged? How do they deal with unauthorized/improper access?
- Where can we find data pertaining to the "50% reduction in use-of-force incidents"

1) Michael Youngbay

Not in favor of shotspotter, but feels it would be incompetent to remove it without a replacement. "We can't rely on technology after the fact, we need to curb the violence" -

he states, going on to suggest private financial motives in the SoundThinking deal. He suggests that alderpersons work on improving their reputations in their community and work more directly with the community to decrease violence before it starts.

2) George Blakemore

Begins by pointing out that 2 committees are taking place simultaneous, calling it a "dog and pony show." He attempts to make the alderpeople aware that there is a disconnect between them and community residents. "If the people knew what kind of sh' you are really into, they would not vote for you." 1 party system, broken

system.

3) Zoe Leigh

Suggests that some members of the city council may be pushing a socialist agenda "You can't push a socialist agenda in a capitalist society" "Hispanic KKK"

The issue is "Defund the Police" not due to the black and brown issue with policing, but because "it's a money game"

Suggests that rhetoric is being used to collude with drug and sex traffickers "Everything doesn't have to depend on technology - hire more police"

Consider allowing people with felonies to apply to be police officers.

Rosana Rodriguez Sanchez and Carlos Ramirez Rosa, "cornered" Lori Lightfoot and the executive order prohibiting collusion between ICE and the police.

"American First - currently the only one is Trump..."

4) Jessica Jackson

Apparently was promised help regarding her probate case, and was "straight up sold out." She is "pretty sure, Brandon Johnson let him know, if you want a seat on the school board, you gon mess up her case."

"The whole country is paying attention to Chicago."

Probate fraud? [45:54] Alderman Moore added to role call

[46:28] Star Chase (Sgt Jason Wood, Oak Brook Police Department)

Mispronounced Villegas. Starchase is a "Pursuit Mitigation Tool."

Use in continuing to locate and apprehend offenders even when they flee.

Sgt Wood Plays a clip from CBS news - "deploys darts w/ GPS tags" "entirely eliminating the need to chase criminals" "found... in action in Oak Brook" "can be deployed from a police cruiser, or a handheld launcher" "eliminates the need for a high speed pursuit" "different rules for chasing a wanted criminal" "make an apprehension without having to endanger the lives of those around" "since a few years back" "recover stolen vehicles" "once tag is affixed to a vehicle, it goes to our Dispatch Center" "used on a weekly basis here in Oak Brook"

Sergeant Wood:

Their program began with 2 units on squad cars, a few years ago. Launches a GPS tag with epoxy and a magnet to adhere to the target

vehicle. [52:33]

Sgt Wood: a group (of towns) lacking the resources / manpower that Chicago has. They talked to Chicago Vehicular Highjacking Task Force. Tag can leave the town of Oak Brook (short term battery life).

54:15 - Ald Sposato - Clarifies that a patrol is a 1 man car in Oak Brook? Unless it is an "attack unit", a patrol is 1-man car in Oak Brook.

Sgt Wood notes that Starchase can be deployed from key fob.

[56:25] Napolitano: How is it weather-wise?

Sgt Wood: Oak Brook was the initial agency to adopt the technology in Illinois. Now, S Barrington, Willowbrook, Hinsdale, Elmhurst, Countryside.

Ald Waguespack: Asks about the costs, remarking that the cost seems pretty

low... Sgt Wood:

Launchers can be swapped from car to car.

"Total Asset Program" from Starchase - includes tags, subscription service (yearly)

Waguespack: Does the App software mesh with any other software or device,

e.g. LPR cameras?

Sgt Wood:

[Oak Brook] has the highest density of LPR cameras in the state. **FUSUS run by AXON.** Online RTCC platform. All can be integrated and seen on one map.

Yancy: 1) How much does this cost?

Sgt Wood: vary on vehicle mount or handheld. Hardwired to car battery. Operated

off an air compressor. Per subscription cost. "Unlimited subscription plan"

Yancy: When did you begin using this in OB?

Sgt Wood:

Right before COVID. Initial reason we went was no-pursuit policy. Thru COVID and OB Mall shooting(

Sgt Wood: Prosecution goes, I can't give you numbers on that.

Yancy: 5) Has this been challenged in court?

Sqt Wood:

No. Due to short duration hasn't really been challenged in court"

Sqt Wood:

- For us, because about 90% criminal activity in that area, our 2 man attack unit we are in the mall or near "the Shops" all day.

Ald Taliafarro: How many deployments have there been?

Sgt Wood:

"I don't have the exact answer" pivots to saying that this is about once a week

deployment. Ald Vasquez: "How large is the fleet"

Sgt Wood: Our marked unit fleet - about 13 cars.

- —----: "Scaling up for what a cost would look like. We have settlements where bystanders are being hit. What would the math look like if scaling up. Is there a bulk cost?"
- I'm not privy to all the numbers.
- 2) Does starchase find those and recover them?
 - IT will give a last known location. Not a 100% recovery rate. 290. Make attempt to get them all.
- 3) Are there any instances where it was used when it shouldn't have been? "Fleeing and eluding incident" "1 time use tool" NY signed an agreement and increased it.

Asks to please share the data w/ Chicago.

Ald Chico (former police officer) We'd have to get away from that broad thinking and utilize in specialized units. How important to specialize units instead of broad use.

Sgt Wood talks about Bumpy roads, potholes in Chicago, how difficult it can be to fire a weapon on unsteady ground. The importance of yearly training for tactics in using Starchase.

2) What type of training?

Online training or they send someone out. Train-the-trainer. Description of driving while deploying the tool. Decrease in tunnel vision and auditory exclusion. Yearly training driving techniques. 5 or 10 minutes driving around.

- 3) Accidents and things like that how often do they happen 0 incidents of a crash. There's a lot of times they don't even recognize there's a police officer next to them when we're deploying it. For example at a traffic light.
- 4) Because proximity to expressway, whats the policy in Oak Brook? We went from a no-pursuit policy to a pursuit with approval policy. Pursuits tend to lead to deployments.

"Exigency circumstance tool" Close to 80% subdivisions are LPR access. "If we have not had a case of - this is absolutely the wrong car we shouldn't have used it" [1:27:00] How could this interface w/ aerial surveillance? Drone technology.

Oak Brook has 2 GDI drones. Recently used drone for Agg Vehicular Hijacking and Robbery. Pursuits tend to lead to foot chases, so drone is good.

Many uses for drones - the future of law enforcement.

Many reasons:

- 1) Cost effective
- 2) Fast and Better Service "that excites us to be able to do that"

- 3) Officers on the street a much safer work environment, knowledge of what they're walking into.
- 4) Nationwide 50% decrease in use-of-force incidents (CITATION?)

Commonly used for "overwatch" of situations.

About 10 uses of drones: 1) Threat of terrorism 2) search warrants 3) search and rescue 4) missing persons 5) PSAP (911) 6) Special Events (e.g. DNC)

Command staff finds it a valuable tool for decision-making Increased efficiency as a police department Integrated with current processes and programs (Axon) [1:37:00] Integrated into Axon (Body cameras) Integrating to Genetech (can be seen at SDSC rooms) Gives Situational Awareness.

Sgt Buenrostro: Background is in Law enforcement. Always had an interest in technology, "drones, in particular." Fort example, New York currently has a drone for beach patrols, can identify and deploy a life preserver to a person.

Ald Moore: Do you think you could hire civilians as pilots?

Defers to SGT Orlando (legal) - it would be possible to use civilians. "I think it can be done, but we would have to look at other municipalities etc. It would be something to look at"

Any time we would fly over somebodys property we would be required to get a search warrant. We have a video retainment policy that is in place... every flight has to be approved prior to use....

2) Can you provide any documentation of the policy? That doesn't necessarily mean, whether it be somebody employed or not, are misusing their access to certain things - do you track the actual flight path, if it is retaining what is recorded where is that stored?

[2:27:45] Success stories? - For example, DNC. Secret Service. Following the law, being transparent, building for the future. This is bigger than us, it's going to be around for a while.

Ald Waguespeck: What to do with \$8m back from ShotSpotter? Maybe we could use this to... save some lives.

Significant expense of software, etc. We would request that from government

grants. [2:30:00] Drones with Fire department, carrying fire hose.

There will be a continuing conversation about technology for public safety in the wake of the shotspotter controversy. We have work to do.
