

- Addressing the need for transferable reading and writing skills between subject areas
- Analyzing data to inform decisions and address trends in instruction
- Nurturing a data-driven professional learning community that collaborates on a consistent basis
- Implementing evidence-based instructional practices, including purposeful planning
- Cultivating a growth mindset for all leaders, educators, and students

Goal 1 (Student-Focused)

Kindergarten:

 By May 2024, 75% of kindergarten students will reach benchmark (44 correct sounds) on the Phoneme Segmentation Fluency subtest of the DIBELS assessment.

1st Grade:

 By May 2024, 75% of first-grade students will reach benchmark in both correct letter sounds (55) and whole words read (15) on the Nonsense Word Fluency subtest of the DIBELS assessment.





	 2nd Grade: By May 2024, 75% of second-grade students will reach benchmark (94 words correct) on the Oral Reading Fluency subtest of the DIBELS assessment. 3rd Grade: By May 2024, 75% of 3rd-grade students will score at benchmark on the MAZE DIBELS assessment (15.5). K-5th Students With Disabilities Subgroup: 75% of students in grades K-2 will meet their individual education plan goal related to literacy for the 2023-2024 academic year. 75% of SWD in grades 3-5 will meet their 2023-2024 Growth to Mastery goal on the Spring 2024 LEAP2025.






