Former captain Mark Febery open the batting with debutant Mike Donaldson. Mike looks like he was going to win the game single-handedly inside 20 overs before falling to a fine Nick behind. Srini then joined Mark at the crease and together they put on 59 runs before Mark fell for 25 runs trying to manipulate the ball into the offside. Stick to what you know, Feebs. Lee Pattison our third debutant then joined Srini and both set about punishing the Cornwall attack. They put on 107 runs together before Srini fell for a very stylish 77 with him being very severe on anything remotely short.

New captain David Millard then joined Lee at the wicket and unfortunately witnessed him falling for 43 and missing out on what would've been a very well-deserved debut half century. He also hit the only six of the game before he became the eighth batsman to be clean bowled out of the 14 wickets to fall in the day.
