In my Output 4 Design there were a number of project elements I renegotiated to research and explore further in my capstone year. These include:

- Exploring in more depth:
  - Previous patterns of agricultural change
  - Libertarian models of food production in Europe
  - How groups are resisting or proactively challenging industrial agriculture
  - How & why we domesticated animals for food production
  - How animal farming has affected landscape patterns
  - The ecological roles of animals in systems
- Developing a writing system for myself

What are the root causes of why these elements needed to be re-negotiated?

- Prioritisation of time & energy e.g. emergence of new campaign, challenges in projects, adjusting to changes in life (partner leaving, leaving two jobs, friends in crisis)

## Output 2

In my <u>Output 2 Design</u> here there were a number of project elements that I have renegotiated:

- Prison abolition events now taking place in 2014 as I was still engaged in personal healing to be able to organise at this level in 2013
- People's Action on Poverty in Somerset my main ally has experienced trauma/loss of a family member & so this has been on hold. Am also reflecting if I have capacity to undertake any engagement. I also feel Somerset needs more popular education around power & oppression to really build a movement.
- Permaculture & Prisons project I decided, on reflection, that I would rather focus on the
  prison abolition 2014 plans with the Empty Cages Collective, as a way to be more radical
  and cutting to the source. I feel permaculture can play a role in decarceration however I
  don't think teaching permaculture to prisoners is going to change the prison system as
  much as building a movement for abolition.
