New Business:

A: **FEMA Grant Update - Community Safe Room Project**: I feel we need an agenda item with this optic as to create a transparent action plan toward writing this grant. We have met with Upper 90, our vendor who is drawing up the bus garage schematic. We have worked directly with Jordan Buss, our FEMA grant writer. I will be working on writing draft letters of support for various municipal entities, to receive their support for the grant. B: Board Resolution Adopting the 2024 Juneau County All Hazards Mitigation Plan: To submit for a FEMA grant, we need to have a school board resolution to approve the county's hazard mitigation plan. Updates:

a. State Report Cards:

- i. We received our secure state report cards, and they will go public on the 19th. This report card release is, once again, not comparable to other report cards because they changed all the cut-off scores for proficiency. The following link has an update to increase this level of understanding. Basically, our schools performed at the following levels. We had a CESA 5 data retreat meeting with all our administrators to go over the data and causes for impact on final results. d. Office of School Safety Report:

i. The following link has information from Speak Up Speak Out, a reporting portal/program from the Office of School Safety. Basically, the SUSO received 5,270 tips during the 2023-2024 school year, a more than 40 percent increase from the previous school year. Since the inception of SUSO in 2020, bullying has consistently been the number one tip. It is also common nationally for bullying to be the most reported tip. This tip line is available to our students and families and is posted on our website.
