


Open IntelliJ Project Settings and select Compiler → Annotation Processors, then:

- Check “Enable annotation processing”
 - add path to requestfactory-apt.jar on “Processor path”
 - Under “Processor FQ Name”, add the FQ name of the requestfactory annotation processor: com.google.web.bindery.requestfactory.apt.RfValidator
- Optionally add “verbose=false” under “Processor Run Options”
- add your project’s module under “Processed Modules”



Now you should see requestfactory validation errors when compiling:

```
@ServiceName("gwt.demo.server.SimpleBar")
public interface SimpleBarRequest extends RequestContext {
    Request<Long> countSimpleBar(int shouldNotBeHere);
}
```
