<i>Marbury v. Madison</i>	Does the U.S. Supreme Court have the power to determine whether a law goes against the Constitution?	The Supreme Court ruled that the law Marbury based his claim on was unconstitutional. This was the first time the court ruled a law as going against the Constitution. It determined that the courts have the power of judicial review.
