A big thank you to everyone for helping me figure out how to make our group run in pandemic safe mode. One thing I enjoy about zoom classes and lectures is that it expands our reach, we have access to more teachers and experts. I do miss being in the same room together, though. Going forward, I would like to have a mix of online and in person events (whenever that becomes possible) because we do have quite a few members who are out of the area, or for whom travel is difficult. For the foreseeable future all events will be online to keep everyone safe.

Fees

Due to the pandemic, classes are actually a little cheaper, as we do not have to pay teachers to travel, so there does not seem to be a need to raise dues at the moment. The zoom account we use is free, since I use my work account, and so there has been no extra expense there. However, it makes sense to do away with the member at large category, since being remote is no longer a barrier to attending classes.

I propose the following fee structure for 2021

\$40 for membership (\$45 if donating to the legacy president's fund)

\$20 for members who join after June

\$20 for members who will only be attending 1 class or lecture during the year. This is defined as anything on which the club has to spend money. This replaces our members at-large category. As always, every member can attend get togethers (when we can have them!) and will receive newsletters and emails. If you choose this level, and realize you want more BASG, Liz will be happy to 'bill' you later for the change.


Where do your fees go?

BASG pays all teaching fees and lecture fees for all events out of our pooled membership dues.

Neither Liz nor I take any compensation for our work on behalf of the guild.

Members who elect to take a class pay for the kits and shipping to their home address, at cost.

Ria and Sarah (our former, long-serving management team do not pay membership dues, in recognition for their years of service.) I'd like to mention that both of them continue to be active and supportive members of our group.
