Compounded Semaglutide & Tirzepatide · Physician consultation included · Billed once, 0% installments available

For: TikTok / Instagram Reels / YouTube Shorts / Facebook creators. **The angle:** affordable, doctor-backed access to compounded GLP-1 weight-management medication — from DocSearch, the nationwide health platform bringing care to millions.

Read “Rules of the Road” at the bottom before posting. This is a prescription product with strict FTC and pharmaceutical-marketing rules. The do/don't word list is mandatory — it protects your account, your commissions, and the brand.

1. The core story (memorize this)

Most GLP-1 programs are gatekept by high prices and out-of-stock brand names. DocSearch made it affordable — and a real doctor is part of every plan.

DocSearch is a nationwide health platform serving people in all 50 states. This program gives budget-conscious weight-loss seekers access to compounded Semaglutide and Tirzepatide — with a licensed physician reviewing every patient and approving treatment, and the medication shipped to their door. No hidden fees; plans are billed once.

One-liner: *“Affordable compounded GLP-1 — with a real doctor — from the national health platform that brings care to millions.”*

2. Know the plans

Two compounded medications, three commitment plans. All plans are billed once, with 0% installments available. Standard reference price is \$249/mo.

3-Monthly Plan (Most Popular) — 12-week supply: \$224.10/mo · total \$672.30 · 10% off (save \$74.70)

6-Monthly Plan — 24-week supply: \$211.65/mo · total \$1,269.90 · 15% off (save \$224.10)

12-Month Plan — 48-week supply: \$199.20/mo · total \$2,390.40 · 20% off (save \$597.60)

Who to pitch what: the longer plans have the lowest per-month price and the biggest savings — lead with the 3-month for first-timers, and the 6/12-month for people ready to commit to a full journey.

3. Scroll-stopping hooks (first 3 seconds — pick one)

1. “The cheapest legal way I found to start compounded GLP-1 — with an actual doctor included.”
2. “Brand-name GLP-1 was out of stock (again). So I found this instead.”
3. “Compounded Tirzepatide, a real physician consult, shipped to my door — for under \$225 a month.”
4. “Stop overpaying for weight-loss meds. From a national health platform, not a sketchy website.”
5. “I didn’t think doctor-backed GLP-1 could be this affordable.”
6. “The price you see is the price you pay — no \$100 teaser that jumps to \$300 at checkout.”

4. Video scripts

60-second script (main cut)

[0:00–0:06 — HOOK] “If brand-name weight-loss shots are too expensive or always out of stock — watch this.”

[0:06–0:18 — BRAND STORY] “This is from DocSearch, a nationwide health platform serving people in all 50 states. They offer compounded GLP-1 — Semaglutide and Tirzepatide — with a licensed physician reviewing every single patient.”

[0:18–0:34 — THE VALUE] “Here’s what sold me: the consultation is included, the prescription is included, and it ships to your door. Plans start around \$224 a month — and the longer plans drop to about \$199.”

[0:34–0:48 — TRUST] “It’s compounded medication, prescribed by a real provider after they review you. Not everyone qualifies — that’s the point, there’s an actual doctor in the loop.”

[0:48–0:60 — CTA] “If you’ve been priced out of weight-loss meds, tap my link and see if you qualify. From the health platform millions already trust.”

30-second cut

“DocSearch offers compounded GLP-1 — Semaglutide and Tirzepatide — with a physician consultation and prescription included, shipped to your door. Plans start around \$224 a month and drop to about \$199 on the longer plans, billed once. From a nationwide health platform serving millions. Tap the link to see if you qualify.”

15-second cut

“Affordable compounded GLP-1 with a real doctor included, from DocSearch — the national health platform. See if you qualify. Link below.”

5. Angle scripts (rotate these)

Angle A — “The price” (cost-conscious audience)

“Brand-name weight-loss shots can run many hundreds a month. DocSearch’s compounded GLP-1 starts around \$224 a month — and the 12-month plan is about \$199 — with the doctor consult and prescription included. Same active ingredient class, a fraction of the sticker shock. Link’s below.”

Angle B — “Out of stock” (frustrated-searcher audience)

“Every pharmacy near me was out of the brand-name stuff. DocSearch offers compounded Semaglutide and Tirzepatide with a real physician review — shipped to your door. If you’ve been stuck on a waitlist, this is worth a look.”

Angle C — “The doctor is included” (trust audience)

“This isn’t a no-name website. It’s DocSearch, a nationwide health platform. A licensed provider reviews you before anything is prescribed — not everyone qualifies. That’s exactly what you want with a medication like this.”

Angle D — “The commitment” (ready-to-start audience)

“If you’re serious, the longer plans save the most: the 6-month is about \$211 a month, the 12-month about \$199, billed once with 0% installments available. Compounded GLP-1, physician-backed, from DocSearch. Link below to see if you qualify.”

Angle E — “No-tricks pricing” (skeptic / been-burned audience)

“Ever click a \$100 weight-loss ad and watch it balloon to \$300 at checkout? DocSearch doesn’t play that game. The price on the page is the price you actually pay — billed once, no hidden fees, no surprise upsells, with a real physician included. What you see is what you get: clear prices, real doctors. Tap the link and check for yourself.”

6. Caption template

Priced out of weight-loss meds? DocSearch offers compounded GLP-1 — Semaglutide & Tirzepatide — with a licensed physician consultation and prescription included, shipped to your door. Plans from ~\$224/mo (as low as ~\$199 on the 12-month), billed once. From the nationwide health platform bringing care to millions.

7. Links, tags & hashtag strategy

Your CTA is always the affiliate link

Never send viewers to the DocSearch website, a Google search, or a bare URL. Only your assigned MaxBounty tracking link records the sale. If the buyer reaches the site any other way, the sale is not credited to you and you are not paid.

Tag the official brand account

Tag the official DocSearch account (ask your affiliate contact for the verified handle) and turn on the platform's branded-content / paid-partnership toggle. This adds credibility and keeps you FTC-compliant. Tagging is for trust — the click is always your affiliate link.

Hashtags: use two layers

Layer 1 — Brand tags (always include): #DocSearchGLP1. This pools all creator content in one place and builds the brand.

Layer 2 — Discovery tags (for reach): #compoundedGLP1 #weightlossjourney #telehealth #semaglutide #tirzepatide. Pick 3–5 per post. Do NOT bid on or tag brand-name drug trademarks.

8. Safe talking points (freestyle from these)

- From DocSearch — a nationwide health platform serving millions across all 50 states.
- Compounded Semaglutide and Tirzepatide (say “compounded,” never “generic”).
- A licensed physician reviews every patient; prescription and consultation are included.
- Medication ships to your door. Plans are billed once; 0% installments available.
- Pricing: from ~\$224/mo (3-month) down to ~\$199/mo (12-month). Reference \$249/mo.
- “See if you qualify” — not everyone does, because a real provider is in the loop.
- Say “brand-name GLP-1 medications” instead of naming any trademarked drug.
- Transparent pricing: the price shown is the price you pay — billed once, no hidden fees, no surprise upsells at checkout. What you see is what you get.

9. Rules of the Road (mandatory)

Disclose every time. #ad or “paid partnership,” clearly visible, plus the platform's branded-content toggle. FTC requirement — non-negotiable.

It's a prescription product. Always include that it requires a physician consultation, that not everyone qualifies, and that results vary.

DO say: “compounded” Semaglutide / Tirzepatide; “physician consultation included”; “see if you qualify”; “brand-name GLP-1 medications” (generic reference).

DON'T say — ever:

- Call it a “generic” version of any brand-name drug
- Name or bid on brand-name pharmaceutical trademarks (Ozempic, Wegovy, Mounjaro, Zepbound, etc.)
- Fake doctor endorsements or unauthorized “before & after” photos
- Guaranteed or specific weight-loss / health-outcome promises (“lose X lbs”, “guaranteed”)
- Claims it's FDA-approved, “clinical,” or “medical-grade”
- Made-up stats, fake studies, or income promises

Keep offers current. Only quote the prices/terms on the official product page. Use only your assigned affiliate link.
