MBNA Board and Committee Introductions

Patty Toraason's term of office has been completed and she was thanked for her leadership on the board. Members of all the committees were recognized and thanked for the time and effort they give to MBNA all year.

Highlights of 2016-2017

George Washington Triangle-Pam Elmer

Researched the idea of adding a Christmas tree to the George Washington Triangle. The cost for this, including lighting and insurance, is approximately \$725.

A historical marker is planned for the George Washington statue in the triangle. Awaiting input from SEH regarding style, size and location. Will work with Landmarks for sign content.

Additional decorative street lights have been placed on each of the three corners of the triangle.

Streetscape Plan-Ruth McGinley

Reviewed RFP's from six design firms and chose Short Elliott Hendrickson Inc (SEH) to design our plan. The city council approved our request and initial work began in 2016. MBNA is collaborating with the city and the NorthShore neighborhood association on the plan. The final plan will include priorities chosen by the neighborhoods and will be implemented over a period of time.

Participated in a Walking tour and Visioning Session on April 26. Visioning Session #2 will be held on July 12 at 6 PM in the gym at Emmeline Cook School. The date of the final plan is yet to be determined.

Community Building and Engagement Funds- Adam Kimball

Purchased a 10'x10' Event Canopy, a portable sound system and additional street signs for our neighborhood using CB&E funds.

Emmeline Cook Beautification Project – Polly Kimball

The project is ongoing. Completed to date are new perimeter fencing, entrance plaza, landscaping, lighting, sign and a larger parking lot. Still to be completed are new bike racks and reconstruction of the softball field.

The playground will get a new piece of equipment to replace the wood structure.

The current softball field will be excavated and moved slightly to meet code. There will be a new backstop, fencing, player benches and a small set of bleachers for spectators. Work should begin on the field this summer.

All of these improvements are possible through money received from the Oshkosh School District, the City of Oshkosh, grants, the Community Foundation, Emmeline Cook PTO and generous donations from many city residents.

Project Curb

Oshkosh4Education is sponsoring a one day event to beautify the 17 schools in Oshkosh. Project Curb will be held from 8 a.m. until noon on September 23. GO-HNI

GO-HNI stands for Greater Oshkosh Healthy Neighborhood Inc, It is a private/public nonprofit community development corporation dedicated to strengthening Oshkosh neighborhoods by engaging residents, encouraging reinvestment and elevating community pride

Urban Forestry Grant
