I. INTRODUCTION

This template serves as a guideline for authors preparing manuscripts for submission to the Journal. Authors must ensure that their manuscripts comply with the required formatting standards, writing conventions, and reference style to facilitate a smooth peer-review process and maintain overall publication quality.

Manuscripts should generally be structured as follows: **INTRODUCTION – METHOD – RESULTS AND DISCUSSION – CONCLUSION**. Additional sections may be included where appropriate, depending on the nature of the study. A minimum of **20 references** is required, with at least **30% published within the last five years**. The minimum manuscript length is **6 pages, excluding references**.

II. PAGE LAYOUT

Manuscripts must follow the formatting requirements of the Journal to ensure uniformity and professional presentation. Authors are encouraged to use this document as a template and replace the sample text with their own manuscript content.

A. Page Layout

The manuscript must be prepared using **A4 paper size** is 210mm (8.27") wide and 297mm (11.69") long. The margins must be set as follows:

Top = 19mm (0.75")

Bottom = 28mm (1.1")

Left = Right = 14.32mm (0.56")

The document must be formatted in a **two-column layout** with a space of 8.5 mm (0.34") between columns.

III. PAGE STYLE

All paragraphs must be **justified** (aligned left and right). The first line of each paragraph should be **indented**. Consistent formatting throughout the manuscript is required to maintain professional presentation.

A. Text Font of Entire Document

The entire manuscript must use **Times New Roman** font. The use of non-standard or embedded fonts is not permitted except for special symbols or equations. Recommended font sizes are shown in Table 1.

B. Title and Author Details

The **title** must be written in **18 pt font**, centered, and clearly reflect the scope and contribution of the manuscript. Each significant word in the title should be capitalized, except for short minor words such as "a", "an", "and", "as", "at", "by", "for", "from", "if", "in", "into", "on", "or", "of", "the", "to", and "with".

Author names must be written in **11 pt font**, centered below the title. Affiliations must be written in **10 pt italic**, including at least the **department, institution, city, and country**. The corresponding author's **email address** must be provided. All title and author information must appear in a **single-column format**.

Academic titles (e.g., Dr., Prof.) and professional positions must not be included in the author information. The family name should be written as the last part of each author's name to avoid ambiguity in indexing and citation. A valid and active **email address** is required for correspondence and editorial communication.

C. Section Headings

No more than 3 levels of headings should be used. All headings must be in 10pt font. Every word in a heading must be capitalized except for short minor words as listed in Section III-B.

1) *Level-1 Heading*: Must be centered, written in **Small Caps**, and numbered using **uppercase Roman numerals** (e.g., I, II, III). The headings “Acknowledgment” and “References” must not be numbered.

2) *Level-2 Heading*: Must be left-aligned, written in **italic**, and numbered using an uppercase letter followed by a period (e.g., A., B., C.).

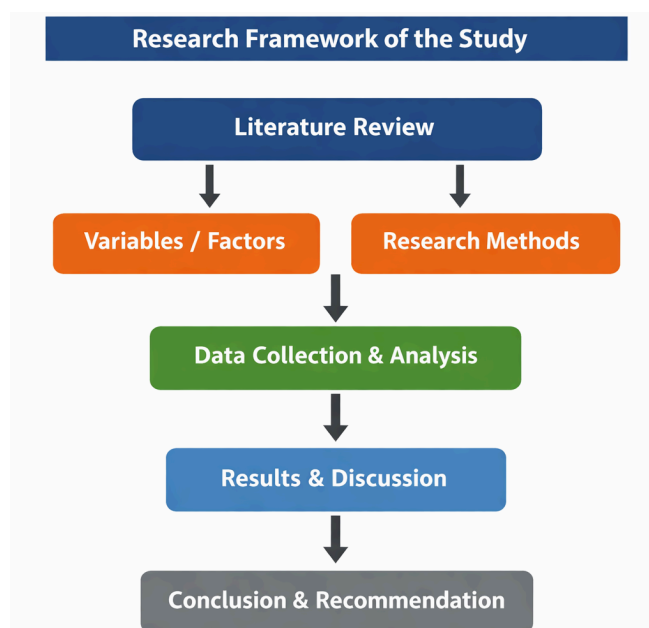
3) *Level-3 Heading*: Heading: Must be indented, written in **italic**, and numbered using an Arabic numeral followed by a parenthesis (e.g., 1)). The text should continue in the same paragraph.

D. Figures and Tables

Figures and tables must be centered within the column. Large figures and tables may span across both columns and must be placed at the **top or bottom of the page**. Any figure or table exceeding one column width must be positioned appropriately to maintain layout balance.

All graphics must be in **high resolution (minimum 300 dpi)** and clearly readable in both color and grayscale formats. Avoid decorative patterns or low-contrast color combinations. Use **solid fill colors** that remain distinguishable when printed in black and white.

Figures should present meaningful academic content such as research frameworks, conceptual models, diagrams, charts, or visual representations of findings. For example:



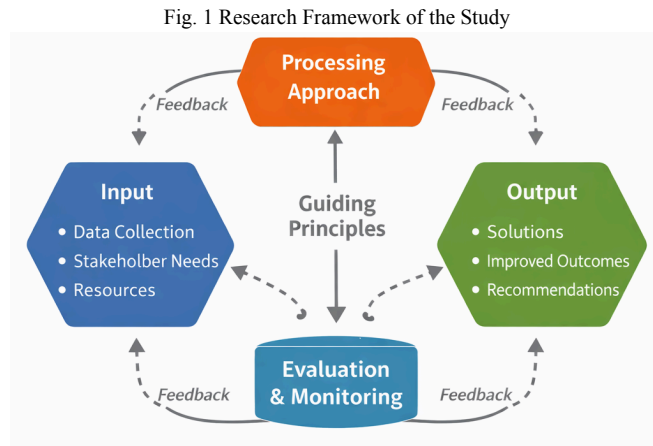


Fig. 2 Conceptual Model of the Proposed Approach

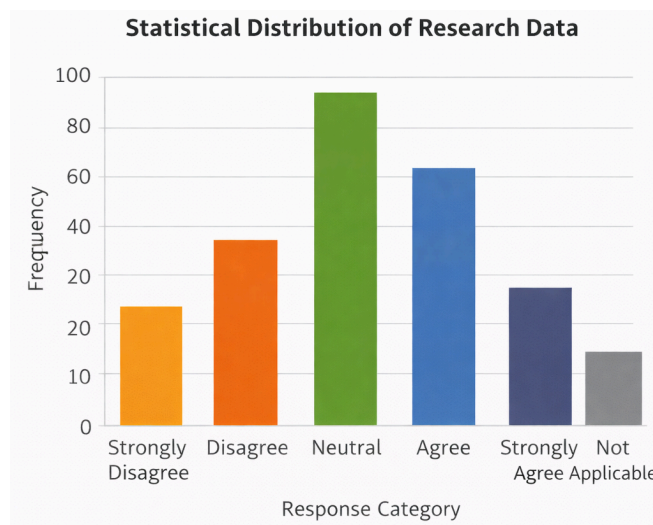


Fig. 3 Statistical Distribution of Research Data

Ensure that all visual elements are clear and professionally formatted. Authors must verify that: colors contrast clearly in both digital and printed formats, images are sharp and not pixelated, all labels, legends, and annotations are **legible and consistent** in font style and size.

E. Figure Captions

Figures must be numbered consecutively using **Arabic numerals** (e.g., Fig. 1, Fig. 2, Fig. 3). Each figure must include a clear and concise **caption** written in **8 pt font**.

The caption must be placed **below the corresponding figure**. Single-line captions should be centered, while multi-line captions should be justified. Each caption must accurately describe the content of the figure to ensure clarity and consistency throughout the manuscript.

F. Table Captions

Tables must be numbered consecutively using **uppercase Roman numerals** (e.g., TABLE I, TABLE II, TABLE III). Each table must include a clear and concise **caption** written in **8 pt font**.

The caption must be placed **above the corresponding table** and centered. Major words in the table caption should be capitalized, except for short minor words (e.g., and, of, in, on, to, with). The caption must accurately describe the content of the table to ensure clarity and consistency throughout the manuscript.

G. Page Numbers, Headers and Footers

Page numbers, headers, and footers must not be added by authors. These elements will be managed during the final publication process.

H. Links and Bookmarks

Hyperlinks and bookmarks may be removed during the production process. Authors should write all URLs and email addresses in full text format to ensure accessibility.

I. Equations

Equations must be clearly formatted and centered. Each equation should be numbered consecutively using **Arabic numerals in parentheses**, aligned to the right margin. All variables and symbols used in the equation must be defined immediately after the equation.

Example:

$$Y = aX + b \quad (1)$$

where Y represents the dependent variable, X represents the independent variable, a is the regression coefficient, and b is a constant.

IV. CONCLUSIONS

Authors must ensure that the manuscript strictly follows the formatting guidelines provided in this template. Manuscripts that do not comply with the required format may be returned for revision prior to the review process.

Manuscripts must be submitted through the **official submission system of the Journal**. Submissions sent via email will not be processed.
