

LETTER TO CPS – ASSERTION OF MY FEDERAL AND STATE RIGHTS

To Whom It May Concern,

This letter serves as formal notice that I am fully aware of my constitutional rights as a parent under federal laws of the United States and state laws of Montana.

You are hereby advised of the following:

1. Entry Without Consent or Warrant

You may not enter my home without my express consent or a valid court order based on probable cause. Any attempt to do so without proper legal authority will be documented and may be challenged in court.

2. Right to Remain Silent

I reserve my right to remain silent and decline to answer questions without legal representation. I understand that any statements I make may be used against me.

3. Right to live without Government Interference

As a family, we have the right to live together without government interference, and not be separated without Due Process of Law and equal protection of laws.

3. Right to Be Present During Interviews

My child may not be interviewed without my presence unless you can provide a valid court order granting such authority. Doing otherwise violates MCA 41-5-331.

4. Demand for Due Process and Documentation

Please provide in writing the full nature of the allegations, the legal basis for your inquiry, and all documentation you intend to use in this matter. I will not sign or agree to any plan or service without time to review and seek legal advice.

5. Federal Oversight and Civil Remedies

Any action taken under color of law that violates my federally protected rights — including the rights protected under the First, Fourth, Fifth, and Fourteenth Amendments — may result in legal action under 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

I am recording all interactions and will maintain a full record of this investigation.
