- 3.) <u>ad hominem</u>: Latin, attacking a person rather than their argument (Short for argumentum ad hominem (literally meaning 'argument against the person')
- 4.) status quo: Latin, the existing state of affairs (literally 'to this')
- 5.) per se: Latin, by itself or in itself (literally 'to infinity')
- 6.) joie de vivre: French, keen or buoyant enjoyment of life
- 7.) en route: French, on or along the way
- 8.) <u>mazel tov</u>: Hebrew, congratulations; good luck.
- 9.) verboten: German, forbidden
- 10.) <u>vis-à-vis</u>: French, in relation to; as compared with (literally 'face-to-face')
