- 1.) [carpe diem](#): Latin, make the most of every moment (literally 'seize the day')
- 2.) [non sequitur](#): Latin, a conclusion or statement that does not logically follow from the previous statement (literally 'it does not follow')
- 3.) [ad hominem](#): Latin, attacking a person rather than their argument (Short for argumentum ad hominem (literally meaning 'argument against the person'))
- 4.) [status quo](#): Latin, the existing state of affairs (literally 'to this')
- 5.) [per se](#): Latin, by itself or in itself (literally 'to infinity')
- 6.) [joie de vivre](#): French, keen or buoyant enjoyment of life
- 7.) [en route](#): French, on or along the way
- 8.) [mazel tov](#): Hebrew, congratulations; good luck.
- 9.) [verboten](#): German, forbidden
- 10.) [vis-à-vis](#): French, in relation to; as compared with (literally 'face-to-face')
- 11.) [¿Qué pasa?](#): Spanish, What's up? (literally 'What has happened?')
- 12.) [déjà vu](#): French, the feeling that you've unexpectedly seen or done something before (literally 'already seen')
