Trillium Project Description - A curated day of **read, watch, listen, and reflect** activities. The experience will allow you to see how you are in relationship with sustainability, and how it is integrated across curricula of all kinds.

***Budget** - \$5431.74 of \$8,000 estimate spent, some expenses may come in a little higher. We utilized local catering, and the event was almost entirely zero waste. We piloted this with a lean perspective, for a proof of concept. We anticipate that next year we can expand registrations and solicit additional speakers along with increased K12 participation, based on this year's registrations. We hope to roll over funding for the 2026 conference.

52 total educators registered for the Trillium Project overall.

- 24 total people attended the in-person/synchronous event, 15 of those were educators, and the remainder represented facilitators, media support, and presenters (all of whom were participants as well).
- 37 total people registered for the remote, asynchronous option.
- 35 registrants were Cal Poly Humboldt faculty, staff and students.
- 11 registrants were from national/international educational institutions or organizations.

Connecting Higher Education to K12


