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Illuminated Manuscripts (gold and acrylic paint, on paper) Glitter, if you really want Assigned: Wed. 5/3 Due: Individual In class 30 POINTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Decide whether you want to design the 1st letter of your first name or last name. Design your own letter or print out a font that you like and use it as a template and trace onto your paper. Add decoration to the inside of your letter and create a decorative border. You can also create a <i>historiated</i> (a letter made up of figures; ie, <u>Initial R</u> from <i>Moralia in Job</i>). For a historiated illumination, choose a simple font to use as a guide. SEE EXAMPLES ON WEBSITE UNDER PROJECTS > ILLUMINATED MANUSCRIPTS Choose a theme: political commentary, fantasy, floral, religious, nature, feminism... You can use historical photographs, 2D works, and sculptures, or installations. 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<p>Gallery Walk</p> <p>(foam core, paint, printed images, hot glue)</p> <p>Assigned: 5/3 Due:</p> <p>Group of 4 or less</p> <p>In Class</p> <p>30 points</p>	<p>Layout: <u>Design a layout for your gallery. It must not exceed a base of 15" x 20"</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You want to make sure that it has a good logical flow for smooth foot traffic and to allow crowds to gather around popular works of art. Sketch this plan out. It's really hard to wing it because of all the measuring. Be sure to include doorway entrances/exits, walls, benches, plants, lighting and directional lighting. There are lots of online programs to use to make this plan look legit. Check out the class website for more info. <p>Choosing Artworks: <u>Decide if you want a theme, a particular time period, a region, artist, or a culture to curate.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You will become an expert and decide on which exact artworks you want to include. You do not have to choose works we've covered in class or art present in your textbook. You can literally bring ANY artwork to your gallery. Print out these artworks. Must be in good quality, not pixelated, and no artworks that had the printer running out of ink. You will glue these to the walls of the gallery. Consider frames??? <p>Constructing the Walls: <u>You're the architect/contractor.</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Build your own walls. Your walls may be any color as long as it's part of your theme, including white. Must have neatly cut walls and glued nicely so that the glue is not visible. Do not include the roof unless we can see into the building or you have skylights/holes... <p>Presentation: Justify your decisions.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Why/how did you choose the artworks? Why did you design your gallery the way it is? What is special about your gallery? Why/how did you decide where the artworks are going to go? Where is your gallery located (city, plaza, building...)? What will your reception/grand opening be like?
