


# Butterfly: From Refugee to Olympian

## One-Pager District Summer Read Assignment

A One-Pager is a way of responding to a book on one piece of paper. It represents your own written and graphic interpretation of what you have read.



Use the checklist to complete the requirements below:

- ☐ Use white, standard sized (8 ½ x 11), unlined paper.
  - ☐ You are welcome to [print one of these templates](#) or draw one your own.
- ☐ Use color pens, pencils, crayons or markers to **generate your one pager by hand. These are NOT computer generated**
- ☐ Fill the entire page (very little white space left showing).
- ☐ Choose ONE ring from above and focus your one pager on the section pages and theme within that one ring. You are NOT completing a one-pager for the entire book. (For example, if you choose the red ring, you will focus your one-pager on Part 5 - The Trap and the theme of KINDNESS). Include the following on your one-pager. Check them off as you go!:
  - ☐ Title and author of the book
  - ☐ The theme associated with the ring you chose.
  - ☐ A one-paragraph (4-6 sentences) summary of the section
  - ☐ Name(s) and brief character description(s) of the person(s) involved in that section
  - ☐ Visually or verbally, communicate the setting; time, place, atmosphere
  - ☐ Have at minimum one symbol that relates to the theme of the ring you chose with a one sentence explanation.
  - ☐ Include 2-3 words or images that capture the writing style.
  - ☐ Two vocabulary words with definitions. Choose words from the section that were unfamiliar to you. Include the page #

☐ Include a quotation that you feel communicates the relationship between the section and the theme most effectively. Explain how it connects to the theme of the ring (2 sentences). Include the page #.

☐ On the back of your one-pager include a personal response (2-3 paragraphs) to the following: ***What lesson(s) do you think Mardini was trying to convey by telling her story? Did you find it important or relevant for readers like you? What did or didn't you like about this book? Would you recommend it to another reader?***

☐ Write your name, grade level, and English teacher's name on the back.

☐ Proofread your written work. Try to eliminate errors in spelling, punctuation etc. Remember that this assignment is an opportunity to make a good first impression

## **ONE-PAGER EXPECTATIONS**

Students will submit one-pagers to their English teachers on the first day of school for a small classwork grade to be incorporated into their study of *Butterfly* to start the school year. Here are some points to consider:

- ☐ Includes all required elements
- ☐ Clear organization of thoughts using different sections, backgrounds, etc...
- ☐ Shows meaning through text, image, symbols etc...
- ☐ Information is factually accurate
- ☐ Detailed text and illustrations demonstrate connection between the text and the theme
- ☐ Correct definitions and usage of vocabulary terms
- ☐ Text is legible and accurate (grammar & spelling)
- ☐ Little white space, visually appealing, colorful
