

Works Cited Worksheet

NOTE: if you are writing a citation by hand, you may underline things instead of using italics.

NOTE: if you cannot find the date on a website, write ND where the date should be.

Book:

Author's Last name, First name. *Title of Book*. Publisher, Publication Year.

[EXAMPLE: Yousafzai, Malala. *I Am Malala*. Little, Brown and Company, 2013.]

Encyclopedia Article:

"Name of article." *Title of encyclopedia*. Publication Year.

[EXAMPLE: "France." *Worldbook*. 2015.]

A page from a website:

"Name of page." *Name of Whole site*. Date updated. Web address. Date you viewed it.

[EXAMPLE: "Blind Date with a Book!" *JFK Middle School Library!* 2 Feb 2017.
jfkmiddlechoollibrary.blogspot.com/2017/02/blind-date-with-book.html. 12 Jun
2017.]

YouTube (or other video source):

"Name of video." *Website*, Who it was uploaded by, When it was uploaded, Web address.

[EXAMPLE: "Evil Librarian by Michelle Knudsen - Book Trailer." *YouTube*,
uploaded by
Candlewick Press, 8 Sep 2014, www.youtube.com/watch?v=yHC9fdJT6Cs.]

Image:

Artist's last name, first name. "Title of image." *Name of Whole site*. Date updated. Web address.

[EXAMPLE: Cole, Brett. "A girl tends to her Llama in Yanque, Peru, a tiny
village along the
Colca Canyon." *Brett Cole Photography*, ND,
www.brettcolephotography.com.]

Twitter:

Twitter handle. "Text of tweet." *Twitter*, Date and time of tweet, Web address of tweet.

[EXAMPLE: @jk_rowling. ".@benjaminroffman Anthony Goldstein, Ravenclaw, Jewish
wizard."
