The Title I Reading Program provides supplemental instruction in reading and ongoing assessments in order to address the specific reading needs of Title I children within the school's communications curriculum.
- 2. Scheduled school-wide conferences are held in November and February. Conferences can also be scheduled throughout the year by either the teachers or the parents/guardians.
- 3. The parents/guardians receive information about their child's progress in reading-related areas through regular classroom mid-quarter progress reports, quarterly report cards, Title I progress reports, and standardized assessment results.
- 4. Title I teachers are available during their morning professional duties time and preparation period for person-to-person or phone conferences. Also, they are available to meet parents/guardians of Title I children at Back to School Night, Title I meetings, workshops, and Parent Conference Nights.
- 5. The parents/guardians will have many opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's educational program in one or more of the following:
