This final assignment of the semester will be an exploration in digital pedagogy and autobiography. You will create a digital presentation (a video or voiceover powerpoint) to share with your classmates about what it means to you, as both a student *or* a teacher, to have an equitable, diverse learning environment in early childhood and elementary school.

As you scroll down, you'll see some suggested tools and ideas to consider when you're ready to get started on this project.
