

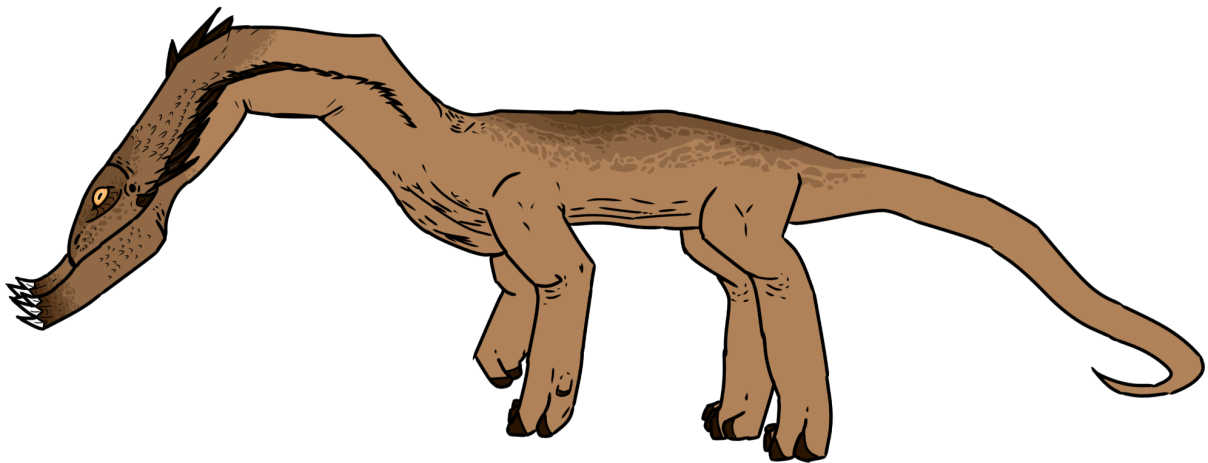
Excavator -> Longum Collum / Excasaurus

The Excasaurus are 5m-6m tall and 10m-11m long creatures. Their diet consists of leaves, fruits, and underground roots making it a herbivore.

Physiology

The Excasaurus has a long but tough neck and a specialized bone between its head to help the Excasaurus to make a complete 180° turn with its head while keeping it steady. It also has a large curved underbite it can use to carry things like rocks, boulders, and eggs. Its jaw can also make a low growl used to attract mates while fending off predators. And not only that, but its eyes are located right on the top of its head so its vision isn't able to get obstructed by its jaw. Supported by powerful eyelids, it can dig head first while not having to worry about dirt or dust getting into its eyes. But the only flaw about its eyes is that when the Excasaurus is in the middle of digging, it is unable to catch predators sneaking up behind it.

Its eggs also appear to be a perfectly spherical ball that is around 50cm big and also comes with an unpleasant taste to fend off predators from eating the other eggs.



Behavior

The Excasaurus are usually docile and will only attack when it sees something that is an extremely deadly threat. But when any creature is close to its nest, it will first growl as a warning. But if that creature gets closer, the Excasaurus will mercilessly stomp at that creature

until it either flees or dies. And most of the time when an Excasaurus is in the middle of stomping a threat, the others will sometimes also join.

And when a female Excasaurus is about to lay an egg, then will dig a large wide pit it can lay its eggs (making that Excasaurus the Alpha). Other female Excasauruses can also nest in the surrounding area, but they have to dig the pit smaller than the Alpha Excasaurus that dug the pit in the first place. Some male Excasauruses can also stumble upon the nesting ground and can choose to protect the nest and young, lashing out at anything that poses a threat. And sometimes when a pack of Excasauruses notices that they either nested in a hostile environment or another creature's territory, the male will carry 1 or 2 eggs from the females' nests as the females cover the pits with either dirt or sand leaving almost no trace of when they nested there. And the Alpha Excasaurus to lead the way to a more suitable environment.

- **How to recognize Excasaurus Nesting Grounds**

An average Excasaurus Nesting Grounds can be located around fields, forests, and rarely in oases. In places with dense vegetation where an Excasaurus nesting ground are, there will always be a path leading to the nest. Caused by Excasauruses that walk back and forth while consuming leaves and plants in their way. But if the nest is around somewhere without very dense vegetation, you need to be on the lookout for 3m - 5m deep pits.
