Secretary's Report

This was a year of stops and starts, with Covid impacting a lot of what we were trying to achieve, notably with a reduction in player numbers hampering our recent growth, no progress on getting a juniors side up and running (despite all the hard work that was done by the juniors committee) and the postponement and (at this stage) cancellation of all our 50th year celebrations we had planned.

Due to the stops and starts, there was a lot of work for the committee this year - two preseasons, consolidation and confirmation of teams and playing numbers, much organisation and reorganisation attempting to put on this year's presentation etc. Despite this, the executive and committee remained positive and has led the club through a challenging year in a fantastic way. I especially want to thank the new executive members – Zoe, Flick and Liam – for their efforts during the year, as well as Todd, whose steady hand on the tiller has enabled us to remain on the right course financially, despite some challenges.

There have been some positives on the Secretarial side of the club with new and improved match card systems cutting down on weekly administration time and the use of other technologies to help keep our members engaged. Moving forward, the University is implementing a new system for our members to pay fees (which will hopefully finally make the process a smooth one) and our historical club records have been much updated thanks to Ian Jessup and Ellie Evans.

Treasurer's Report

Financial Summary

What has been a challenging year for the club, financially we were well prepared. The club budget was revised due to the shortened season and reduced memberships and sponsorship. Fortunately, we were able to reduce club registration costs proportionally and maintain our target to breakeven at season end. The biggest challenge faced this year were the technical difficulties with university website point of sales and reconciliation delays. These issues were resolved, however not a great member experience, with appropriate feedback raised. Cash balance fell for the first time in four years due to our current uniform inventory, currently valued at \$8,450

The club remains in a very strong financial position with a positive economic outlook. Restructuring our spending policies and tightening our spending patterns have allowed the club to close in a neutral position. The club is well positioned to grow in the coming seasons.

Significant Changes to financial position/policies

- Continued financial support from University for turf hire
- Association, turf and umpiring costs in line with forecast and budgeted appropriately
- All social events run at break even and self-funded, including presentation night
- Introduction of sponsorship program, encouraging and rewarding players to bring in new sponsors
- Fees budgeted to breakeven

Budget Outlook

Current fee structure should allow the club to sustain for the coming years, subject to unforeseen costs. At this stage 2021 fees will revert back to 2019 rates dependent on membership numbers, University funding and financial support from our sponsors.

Investing for the Future

Potential for current cash balance to be utilised in coming seasons to encourage growth and expansion. The club will continue investigations and discussions around the possibility to secure new turf facilities. A drive to invest in the future, incorporating additional investments for coaches, junior affiliations and player development. The club will also look to upgrade website and e-commerce facilities.

Women Second Grade (ML4)

My proudest moment was seeing the excitement of the girls as they came off the field from our 1-0 win. To us, it felt like we'd won the grand final. All the hard work put in over the year, felt like it had finally paid off.

The girls were a joy to coach, I thoroughly enjoyed working with each and every one of them to improve their game. There was never a dull moment coaching the team and I hope to see them all return next year.

Women Third Grade (ML5)

The 3rd grade women was an entirely different team this year, with many of last year's members getting promoted to 2nd grade. The 3rd grade ladies didn't shy away from the challenge and this gave many players the opportunity to try different positions and to learn new skills and workflows. With a squad composed of a few returning players, some promoted 4th grade players and some club newbies, this really drove the energy and enthusiasm at training, the girls taking on any challenge that I threw their way.

Although not necessarily reflected on the scoreboard, this group of incredibly hard-working women put up a strong battle every single game, never quitting on each other and improved throughout the season. Plenty of old boys were itching to get back onto the paddock and by the time February rolled around we had 18 names – some of whom had not played for a decade.

We entered the Sydney Cup, which is the second grade of Sydney Men's Masters Hockey. Six of the seven teams could have made the semi-finals, so this made for good competitive hockey each week.

First round we started with a win, downing Northern District 3-2. Ryde soon gave us a wake-up call, then Macarthur beat us after the fulltime siren from a dodgy corner decision.

Covid shut the comp down mid-March, and when it started again in mid-July we had lost 3 players but gained two in "youngsters" Andrew Herron and Peter Kohlhagen.

It's tough going playing 9.30pm in the middle of winter with no subs or only one sub – but this ironically when we played our best hockey, registering four wins, a draw against eventual premiers Briars and a loss to Manly-GNS again from an umpiring error.

The last few games were against very strong opponents and while we didn't get wins in those games, we had done enough to finish a highly commendable third on the table.

We then made Briars fight every inch of the way in the semi-final, losing 1-0 but earning their respect.

Darren Cox was a thoroughly deserved players' player.

Nearly all the team had played 1st grade for Macquarie at some stage of their hockey life and so there was plenty of experience and skill to call on.

This project was as much a reunion as anything and there was such joy displayed each game that everyone has indicated their desire to play again in 2021.

The Masters team was a rare piece of good news in a year blighted by the coronavirus.
