

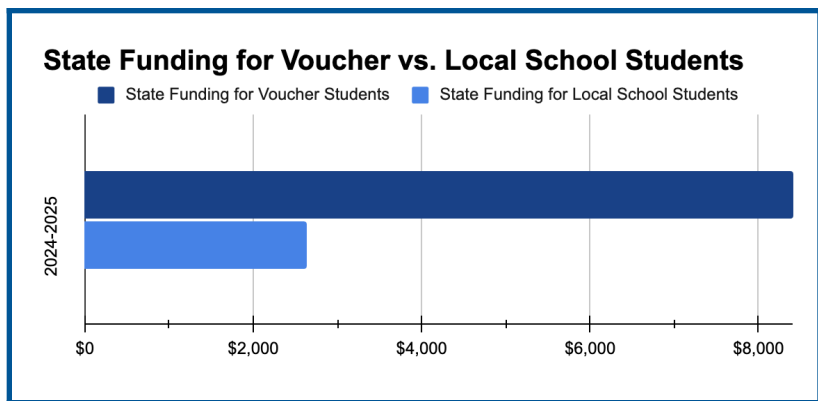
Facts on Private School Vouchers Maumee City Schools

2024-2025 Numbers for EdChoice Expansion Vouchers*

- ★ **2,053** students enrolled in Maumee City public schools and the district receives **\$2,635** from the state share of base cost per student
- ★ **242** students who live in the district are using private school vouchers
 - They can receive up to **\$8,408** from the state per student, and there's no income cap—even billionaires are now eligible for at least some public money for private school

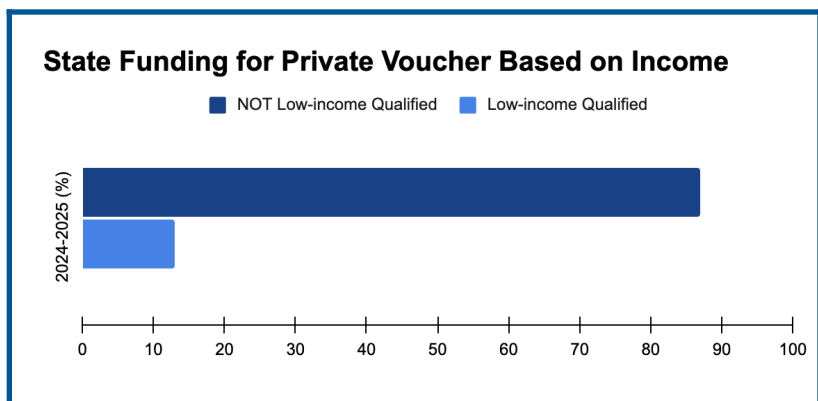

Ohio Facts on Private School Vouchers: EdChoice Expansion Scholarships

- ★ **Ohio funds five voucher programs that use public money for private education.** EdChoice Expansion is the most recent program and in 2024-2025, Ohio gave out 69,000 new vouchers but private school enrollment grew by less than 3,700 students—these programs divert public school dollars to pay tuition for families that were already able to afford private school on their own.
- ★ **“School choice” actually means private schools choose their students.** Unlike public schools that must accept all students in their residential area, private schools can choose which students they accept.
- ★ **Ohio has fully funded each voucher program** for private schools, but it has never fully funded public schools.
- ★ **There is no accountability for public dollars that go to private schools.** Unlike public school districts that have to show their communities and the state how public money is spent, private schools do not.
- ★ **Public schools exist everywhere in Ohio.** Ten Ohio counties have no access to voucher-accepting private schools.
- ★ **More money to vouchers means less money to public schools.**
- ★ **Vouchers punish the 90% of Ohio students who attend public schools.** By prioritizing increased voucher expansion, legislators show they do not see public schools as a priority.
