

## PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Brogden Middle School agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Consistent with section 1116, Brogden will ensure that the required school level parent/family
  engagement policy meets the requirements of section 1116 of ESSA, and includes, as a
  component, a school-parent/family compact consistent with section 1116 of ESSA.
- Schools will notify parents/families of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. The policy will be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and Brogden.

- 5. - 6. Brogden Middle School shall provide each parent/family an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
  - Parent/Teacher Conferences
  - Individual Student Reports
  - Progress Monitoring Reports
  - Phone Conferences and Student Data Chats
- 7. Brogden Middle School shall take the following actions to provide each parent/family timely notice when their child has been assigned or has been taught for four (4) or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified:
  - Parents' Right to Know Notifications
- 8. Brogden Middle School shall provide assistance to parents/families of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described below --
  - the state's academic content standards,
  - the state's student academic achievement standards,
  - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
  - the requirements of Title I Part A,
  - how to monitor their child's progress, and
  - how to work with educators
  - Conference Nights
  - Brogden Community Days
- 9. Brogden Middle School shall provide materials and training to help parents/families work with their children in the areas of improving student achievement, (including literacy training and using technology) child development, child rearing and additional topics parents may request.

  - Newsletters with strategies to assist students
  - Creating and sending resources to families
- 10. Brogden Middle School shall, with the assistance of its parents/families, educate its teachers, student services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents/families as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
