

2025 – 2026 Middle School Communication Guide

Good communication is essential to a productive partnership between home and school. To this end, parents are encouraged to address questions or inquiries related to a child's specific class with the teacher directly and include the advisor in all such communications. Your child's advisor serves as the touchpoint for all other questions related to your child's experience.

If you have questions, please refer to the samples below for specific situations and the corresponding faculty and staff members to contact. When in doubt, it is always best to start with your child's advisor, who can direct you to the correct individual, as needed.

If you have general questions regarding the middle school:

Call the Middle School Office at (718) 329-7354 or email schooloffice-fm@ecfs.org.

If your child will miss any part of a school day for an appointment or illness, you are required to inform the MS Office as soon as possible.

- 1. An email must be sent to msattendance@ecfs.org, and advisor must also be included in the email. To call in an absence, please call (718) 329-7354.
- 2. Students are expected to check their teachers' Google Classroom for all classes they miss for assignments and/or email the teacher directly with questions.
- 3. For extended absences, the dean and advisor should be notified.

If your child is having physical or medical-related challenges that may impact his/her participation at school, a doctor's note or information must be shared with our school nurse and the PE Department Chair. Your child's advisor should be copied on all such communications:

- 1. Contact your child's advisor and the school nurses: nurses-fs-fm@ecfs.org
- 2. Contact John Dwinell, the P.E. department chair, if appropriate: idwinell@ecfs.org

If your child works with an outside tutor, it's important that we are aware of this so that we are able to support your child and the tutor's work together. Inform your child's advisor, the subject area teacher(s), and the learning specialist, if your child works with one.

If you or your child has a question or concern related to a specific course of study:

- Contact the subject-area teacher first, if your question is specific to one course. You and the teacher may
 decide to involve the learning specialist, if your child works with one, and it is appropriate to your question
 or concern. Your child's advisor must be included in communications with subject area-teachers so that
 they can also provide support as needed.
- 2. If you have questions regarding more than one course, contact your child's advisor.

If you have a question or concern regarding the curriculum or the MS academic experience:

- 1. Questions related to a specific department should be directed to the designated department chair.
- 2. Contact Isora Santos, Assistant Principal for Academic Life, regarding the MS Academic program.
- 3. Contact Savi Tuber, Interim Assistant Principal for Student Life, regarding any non-academic student programming.

If you have a question or concern about the social/emotional experience for your child:

- 1. Contact your child's advisor first.
- 2. You and the advisor may involve the Grade Level Dean and Jon Alschuler, Middle School Principal.
- 3. You and the advisor may also decide to involve Dr. Sarah Cohn (School Psychologist), Bree Aitoro (MS Counselor) and/or Dr. Solimar Santiago-Warner (MS/US Health and Wellness Lead).
