Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan: The Hon’ble Prime Minister launched the nationwide campaign “Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan” from **17th September to 2nd October 2025**, in conjunction with Poshan Maah. The campaign focuses on improving the health and nutrition of women, adolescent girls, and children, with the objective of strengthening early detection, ensuring access to essential health services, and empowering families to adopt healthier lifestyles for a stronger and healthier India.

- Reaching every district across the country, the campaign achieved an unprecedented scale with **19.7 lakh health camps with a footfall of more than 11 crore** on all healthcare platforms. More than 20 Ministries actively participated in the campaign, which involved Central government institutes, medical colleges and private organisations. The campaign also had participation from Members of Parliament, Members of Legislative Assembly and officials of all the concerned line ministries, making it a “Whole-of-the-Government” campaign.
- Key outcomes of the campaign include over 1.78 crore hypertension screenings, 1.73 crore diabetes screenings, 69.5 lakh oral cancer screenings, 62.6 lakh Antenatal Care check-ups, 1.43 crore vaccine doses and 1.51 crore anaemia tests. More than 85.9 lakh women were screened for tuberculosis, 10.2 lakh for sickle cell disease, and 2.14 crore individuals participated in counselling and wellness sessions.

	Over 2.68 lakh Nik-shay Mitra were registered during the campaign with the active participation of My Bharat Volunteers. • The Union Health Ministry achieved three GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS™ titles under the nationwide “Swasth Nari, Sashakt Parivar Abhiyaan” (SNSPA) campaign, recognizing India’s unparalleled commitment to preventive and women-centric healthcare. • The records achieved are: 1. Most people to register for a health care platform in one month – 3,21,49,711 (Over 3.21 Crore) 2. Most people to sign up for a breast cancer screening online in one week – 9,94,349 (Over 9.94 lakh) Most people to sign up for vital signs screening online in one week (at state level) – 1,25,406 (Over 1.25 lakh)
4.	SAHI & BODH: On February 17, 2026, Union Minister for Health and Family Welfare, Shri Jagat Prakash Nadda, launched two pioneering digital health initiatives — SAHI (Strategy for Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare for India) and BODH (Benchmarking Open Data Platform for Health AI) — during the India AI Impact Summit 2026. The launch marks a significant milestone in advancing safe, ethical, and evidence-based deployment of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in India’s healthcare ecosystem. • SAHI (Strategy for Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare for India) has been conceptualized as a comprehensive framework to promote secure, interoperable, and trustworthy AI solutions in the health sector. The initiative will facilitate collaboration among healthcare institutions, technology developers, researchers, and policymakers to ensure that AI tools meet rigorous standards of safety, efficacy, and ethical compliance prior to large-scale adoption.

	The platform will also serve as a knowledge-sharing and governance hub, promoting best practices in health AI development and implementation, with strong safeguards for patient data protection and algorithmic accountability. • BODH (Benchmarking Open Data Platform for Health AI), developed by the Indian Institute of Technology Kanpur in collaboration with the National Health Authority, will enable systematic evaluation of AI models using diverse, anonymized real-world health datasets. The platform is designed to assess performance, robustness, bias, and generalizability of AI systems before their deployment at population scale. By institutionalizing benchmarking standards, BODH aims to ensure that AI solutions are reliable, clinically relevant, and aligned with national public health priorities.
5.	Deployment of Auto-Adjudication Engine (AAE): NHA has recently deployed a system-driven Auto-Adjudication Engine (AAE) within the Transaction Management System (TMS) to strengthen the efficiency and consistency of claim processing under AB PM-JAY. The AAE carries out automated validation of claims at the initial stage to verify whether all mandatory supporting documents have been uploaded and whether the documents are complete, adequate, and correspond to the correct beneficiary. This system-driven approach has reduced the need for manual checks at these levels, making the process more consistent and less dependent on individual decision-making. It has also contributed to improved adherence by hospitals to prescribed treatment protocols, ultimately supporting better quality of care, along with better compliance and overall governance under the scheme.
6.	Ayushman App for Empowering Beneficiaries: The Ayushman App, now available on both Android and iOS, serves as a comprehensive digital hub designed to empower beneficiaries by enabling them to independently manage

	their healthcare journey. Through the integrated Services Menu, users can verify eligibility, download Ayushman cards, monitor wallet balances, locate empanelled hospitals, and review their full treatment history. The app enhances transparency and accessibility by offering real-time notifications in 19 Indian regional languages, keeping users informed on registration, discharge, claim submissions, and the status of pre-authorizations. Furthermore, the platform facilitates direct engagement through features such as eKYC updates, grievance redressal, and a newly introduced feedback option, ensuring a seamless, user-friendly experience for all beneficiaries.
7.	Some Key initiatives to enable adoption of ABDM are as under: • Scan and Share’- A QR-code-based OPD registration service allows patients to scan the QR code of the facility and share their demographic details. This minimizes long queues at the registration counter and reduces the entry of incomplete or inaccurate data. As of 31st March 2026, 20.49 crore registrations have been enabled in 27,328 facilities in 734 districts across 36 states/UTs. • ‘Scan and Pay’: Scan and Pay empower patients to use their PHR application to scan a facility/lab/pharmacy QR code to view all open orders against their ABHA address and make quick digital payments using any PHR application of choice. Patients can view their digital receipt on their application and avail the service they have paid for. • Model ABDM Facilities initiative: Under the Model ABDM Facilities initiative, select facilities have been identified to showcase end-to-end ABDM-enabled digitization. A total of 89 facilities across 34 States and Union Territories (except Odisha and West Bengal) have been selected to demonstrate complete implementation, including patient registration, digital record creation, consent-based data exchange, and interoperability across systems of medicine. 19 All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) institutions have been onboarded for the comprehensive, end-to-end implementation of ABDM.

	• The National Health Claims Exchange (NHCX) initiative has been launched as a transformative digital platform, often described as the "UPI of health insurance" for its ability to connect hospitals and insurers through a unified system rather than fragmented portals. Functioning as a secure "digital highway," the NHCX transmits claim details without storing sensitive data, directly benefiting patients through faster approvals, real-time tracking via ABHA, and significantly reduced paperwork. By enabling quicker hospital discharges and streamlining communication, the initiative not only enhances the patient experience but also works to minimize fraud and lower operational costs for insurance providers. Ultimately, the NHCX aims to make the entire claims process more seamless, transparent, and truly cashless for all stakeholders involved. • eSushrut@Clinic: eSushrut@Clinic is an affordable and lightweight Hospital Management Information System designed to support digitization of clinics in the private sector. The solution enables ABDM- aligned digital workflows and is being made available at a subsidized cost starting from INR 299 per month, addressing a critical adoption gap in private primary care. Over 350 small clinics are currently using this system. • DHIS: To encourage public and private health facilities to create digital records, a Digital Health Incentive Scheme (DHIS) has been launched since Jan 2023. Till 31st March 2026, an amount of ₹ 136.10 crores has been disbursed to Health Facilities and health-tech companies. Of this, ₹ 109.91 crores has been disbursed to 6,325 healthcare facilities—comprising ₹ 96.72 crores to 5,479 public facilities and ₹ 13.19 crores to 846 private facilities. Additionally, ₹ 26.19 crores have been disbursed to 27 health-tech companies, including ₹11.15 crores to 3 public health-tech companies and ₹ 15.04 crore to 24 private health-tech companies.
