#### NROTC Scholarship Information; See Mr. Tanner:

Navy 4 year option - This scholarship provides a \$200,000 scholarship at over 180+ colleges and Universities and covers 100% of tuition, books and fee or room and board (students choice). With this scholarship any degree can be chosen and is more of a normal college experience vs an Academy that is more of a military experience. If the scholarship is not received during Senior year the other options are 3 year, 2 year or 1 year sideload

scholarships. Once the degree is finished the receiver of the scholarship will go into a Navy

Officer career path.

Nurse Option - This scholarship provides the same benefits but the scholarship recipient will work towards a Bachelors of Science in Nursing. The recipient will commission into the Nurse Corps after college.

Pre-Med Option - Navy-Pre-medical option scholarship program is available to students interested in pursuing a bachelor's degree to prepare for the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) and admission to medical school via a Navy student pipeline via Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USU) or Armed Forces Health Professions Scholarship Program (AFHPSP).

NROTC Minority Serving Institution (MSI) - This scholarship provides the same benefits however, the NROTC has a limited number of scholarships available for students to attend MSI schools, which encompass Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU), High Hispanic Enrollment (HHE) schools, and other Minority Serving Institutions (MSI). Let me be clear in saying that you do not have to be a minority to apply for this part of the scholarship.

NROTC Preparatory Scholarship - NROTC Preparatory Scholarships allow interested high school students, who show great potential via grades, character, and extra-curricular activities but might lack standardized test scores or advanced high school courses, to apply for one-year university, or privately funded scholarships. University NROTC Prep programs are designed to provide students the educational foundation necessary for success in the NROTC program and Navy.
