

ENGLISH TITLE TIMES NEW ROMAN 14 PT

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ABSTRACT

The abstract should be typed as concisely as possible and should be composed of introduction with problem statement, method and equipment, discussion and results, and lastly short conclusion. The abstract should only be typed in one paragraph and one-column format with no more than 200 words.

Keyword: Keyword 1; keyword 2; (sorted alphabetically, ex : air, composite, etc)

INTRODUCTION

Here introduces the paper from the background to the problem statement. The before and after spacing for paragraphs should be 0 and after spacing for sub-title such as **Structure, Method etc** should be 6. Manuscript should be written in A4 size paper, single line spacing, font Times New Roman size 12, with the margin as follows: Left 40mm, Right 30mm, Top 40mm and Bottom 30mm. Please make sure that you do not exceed the indicated type area.

Paragraph 2 and so on should be tab at 0.75 (just like this paragraph). Only paragraph 1 at every sub-heading that is not using tab (like previous paragraph).

STRUCTURE

Files must be in MS Word only and should be formatted for direct printing, using the CRC MS Word provided. Figures and tables should be embedded and not supplied

separately. Please make sure that you use as much as possible normal fonts in your documents. Special fonts, such as fonts used in the Far East (Japanese, Chinese, Korean, etc.) may cause problems during processing. To avoid unnecessary errors, you are strongly advised to use the 'spell checker' function of MS Word.

For the second and so on paragraph, the first word should be tab by 0.75. Then follow this order when typing manuscripts: **Title, Authors, Affiliations, Abstract, Keywords, Main text (Introduction, Method or Material and Method, Results and Discussion, Conclusion; including figures and tables), Acknowledgements (if needed), References, Appendix.**

TABLES

All tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Every table should have a caption. Horizontal lines

should be placed above and below table headings and at the bottom of the table. Vertical lines should be avoided. Title should use Times New Roman font size 10 and centered alignment. Tables must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. Below is an example which the authors may find useful.

FIGURES

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals (1,2,3,..). Every figure should have a caption. All photographs, schemas, graphs and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. Line drawings should be good quality scans or true electronic output. Low-quality scans are not acceptable. Figures must be embedded into the text and not supplied separately. In MS word input the figures must be properly coded. Preferred format of figures is PNG, JPEG, GIF etc. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the caption or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper. Please ensure that all the figures are at least 150 DPI resolutions as this will facilitate good output.

The figure number and caption should be typed below the

illustration in 10 pt and left centered [**Note:** one-line captions of length less than column width (or full typesetting width or oblong) centered].

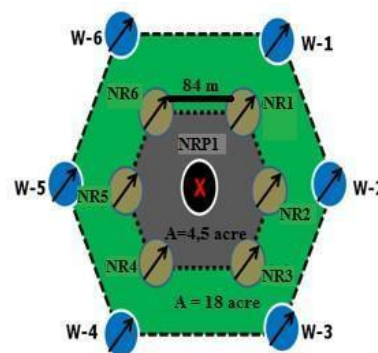


Figure 1. Example of figure.

EQUATIONS

Equations and formulae should be typed in Mathtype, and numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals in parentheses on the right-hand side of the page (if referred to explicitly in the text). They should also be separated from the surrounding text by one space.

$$\frac{q}{q_{\max}} = 1 - 0.2 \left(\frac{P_{wf}}{P_s} \right) - 0.8 \left(\frac{P_{wf}}{P_s} \right)^2 \quad (1)$$

CONSTRUCTION OF REFERENCES

References must be listed at the end of the paper. Do not begin them on a new page unless this is absolutely necessary. Authors should ensure that every reference in the text appears in the list of references and vice versa. Indicate references by last name and years in the text.

Some examples of how your references should be listed are given at the end of this template in the 'References' section, which will

allow you to assemble your reference list according to the correct format and font size. **(We're strongly recommend the author to use Mendeley references manager)**
