#### **L. Summary of my Activities and Future Plans**

Throughout my career I have adopted the notion of Planner as ‘Initiator’ and ‘Social Changer’. I have sought to combine research with practice and in so doing to enrich both. My focus and orientation is three-dimensional: academic, professional and public service on the international, national and local levels, with the aim of promoting social change, community sustainability and peace-building.

Development of Master, Outline and Strategic Plans has provided research opportunities for pursuing the relationships between such plans and the Outline Schemes that guide their implementation. This planning work on a local and regional scale provides a framework for combining planning with social change strategies through community outreach. These activities are carried out in conjunction with municipalities, government ministries, urban planning and development institutions. They offer a broad range of milieus within which theory and practice can be integrated.

Another research area that combines the theoretical and the practical is the development of cultural oriented planning models suitable for adoption within Arab and Palestinians localities. The focus is the interface between law, human behavior and culture in land allocation and management. The objective is to adapt current planning theory and techniques to the needs of traditional Arab societies that are undergoing modernization in both rural and urbanizing settings. This include developing new method and

approaches such as, De- Facto Planning, Planning with the Community, Planning Face to Face est.

A further research emphasis is the urban ecology of divided cities, with the current focus on Jerusalem, Nazareth and other urban localities include planning a New Arab Towns. An additional research interest is the comparative study of planning practice within the Arab-Israeli sector, the Palestinian entity, and the rest of the Arab world. This integrates theory and methodological approaches drawn from applied geography, planning, and urbanization processes. My professional planning experience, together with university teaching and research, provides a deeper understanding of these fields.

In my professional career I have emphasized public service – volunteer lectures, group meetings, and media appearances – as vehicles for heightening the awareness of Israeli Arab officials and the public to the importance of adopting contemporary planning tools and techniques in land-use practices. The objective is to build a support base that secures political sustainability for such practices in rapidly changing environments.

At the same time, I have sought to promote an understanding within the general Israeli planning community – government, university and private practitioners – of the unique challenges facing planning in traditional communities, and the need to adapt general planning approaches to this sector.
