#### What's the difference between Hisp...

- ★ **Hispanic**– Individuals who are Spanish-speaking or have a background in a Spanish-speaking country.
- ★ **Latino**– Individuals who have a background in a Latin American country.
- ★ **Latinx/ Latine**– Reflects all who are from a Latin American country without recognizing gender.
- ★ **Spanish**– Belonging or related to the country of Spain.
