■ What's the difference between Hisp...

- ★ **Hispanic** Individuals who are Spanish-speaking or have a background in a Spanish-speaking country.
- **★Latino** Individuals who have a background in a Latin American country.
- ★Latinx/ Latine-Reflects all who are from a Latin American country without recognizing gender.
- ★ Spanish-Belonging or related to the country of Spain.
