Cybernetics of Desire

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Syllabus

What worlds do our desires produce? This course will explore the process of gathering as a transformative act of communing. Why do we gather, how do we protect the container of our gathering, and afterwards, how do we then carefully dissolve? Cybernetics is the study of how we shape and are shaped by systems. To gather together is to step into a role of great significance, poetry, and responsibility; being clear about our purpose for gathering is part of what sets the conditions to best honor your mind, body, and spirit, and in turn, ask the same of others.

How are social containers weaved, what boundaries will we lay to freely gather within, and how can we move from a place of attunement to personal and collective pleasure?

This class is a hybrid coding, critical theory, and design production class. We will explore desireful gathering through code, somatic exercises, discussion, and collaboration. Participants will be encouraged to develop their own research interests and explore their personal histories. When projects are discussed, we will practice communicating ideas through presentation as a medium and will co-create a culture of constructive feedback. For second-year graphic design students, this course builds on Mindy Seu's On Gathering: Digital Collections and Virtual Events. Part studio, part reading and conversation seminar. This class is intended for those with a working knowledge of HTML and CSS. JavaScript is helpful but not required. Completed projects are expected to be technological in nature.

Orientation

This class is an iteration of On Gathering, extending out from a focus on materials to gather towards a focus on _who_ we gathering, _why_ are we gathering them and _how_ are we gathering them? This 'how' part is the most direct plug back into _what_ materials are we gathering.

We are going to do a kind of pass of our whole semester in one day. Are ya ready? It's like our life will flash before our eyes and we're going to live that together.

What does a speculative liberatory learning environment look like for you for learning about code desire art and gathering?

- * What kinds of subjects would be taught there?
- * Are there teachers and students or other roles? Do the roles ever change?

- * What kinds of relationships would the inhabitants have to each other?
- * Are there grades? Would people be separated into groups? If so, how?
- * What does it look like? What material is the space made out of?
- * Who is there with you?
- * What are the emotional qualities of the space?
- * Consider the many forms it could take.
