The Associates Academy is a carefully designed pathway that allows Buckeye students to earn an Associate of Arts degree through a combination of in person, online, and hybrid CCP courses offered in partnership with Cuyahoga Community College (Tri-C). Students in grades 10-12 will follow a structured course sequence to place them on track to earn their associate degree by the time they graduate from Buckeye High School.

During this information session, families will learn about:

- Program structure and expectations
- Student support systems
- Enrollment requirements and timelines
- Next steps for interested students

We look forward to seeing you and sharing information about this exciting opportunity!

The Buckeye High School and Tri-C Associates Academy is a pathway that offers rising sophomores and juniors the opportunity to earn an Associate of Arts degree while still in high school. Through exclusive access to in-person, online, and hybrid courses offered in partnership with Cuyahoga Community College, students experience a rigorous college curriculum within the supportive environment of Buckeye High School. Designed intentionally for high-achieving high school learners, the program provides the personalized academic and developmental support necessary to excel in college-level work.

Students accepted into this pathway receive priority enrollment in Tri-C partnership courses taught on the Buckeye campus, meet regularly with school counselors to ensure they remain on track for graduation, and benefit from dedicated time with Tri-C advisors to map out their college degree

requirements. Additionally, all 10th and 11th grade Academy students have a built-in daily lab period to complete online coursework, engage in hybrid classes, and receive targeted support from the Associates Academy team.

Buckeye's Mock Trial Team Competes at Medina County Courthouse

All rise! Buckeye High School's Mock Trial team took to Medina County's Courthouse on January 30th to participate in the annual Mock Trial District Tournament. Mock Trial is an after school competitive organization that is offered to students of all high school grade levels here at Buckeye. Throughout the year before the competition - with the help of two professional attorneys and Mr. LaGuardia, Mock Trial advisor - students are asked to dissect and analyze a fictional legal case that asks challenging legal questions. They then have to build a case for both the defense and prosecution, and "act out" the parts within that case -- the attorneys, witnesses, and even the bailiff!

This year, Buckeye's Mock Trial members competed against Lake Ridge Academy and Cloverleaf High School at Medina's Courthouse. Members were exposed to the real-world court setting, and they had their trials presided over by real Medina County judges. These judges score the competition and provide each student with specific feedback denoting what they did well and how they could improve their performance. While our team did not advance beyond the District tournament this year, they did an excellent job and represented Buckeye with superb perseverance and integrity. Beyond the competition, the educational experience and camaraderie that comes with being a member is more than enough to justify participation.
