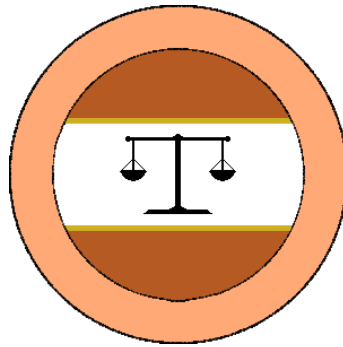
Overall: This event was a really fun event to run, and throughout it, Milk and I were fixing this on the fly with some of these great ideas you came up with. We had some great responses,
