Darting equipment

JAB STICK

automatically discharging jabstick, manufactured of aluminium and stainless steel, which injects 1 - 10 ml in one second or less on contact. This device releases an injection on contact with the animal for safe, humane administration of vaccines or pharmaceuticals.

Gaseous Anaesthetics Machine (can be bought in Indonesia approx cost 20 milion rupiah excl. transport)

An isoflurane or sevoflurane gaseous anaesthesia machine (preferably a portable unit) is one of the most urgent item required in the clinic. It will enable safer anaesthesia of most animals in the centre and most importantly give a safe way to anaesthesise birds and reptiles.

Isolfourane (can be bought in Indonesia approx cost 800.000 rupiah excl. transport)

Anaesthetic gas needed to operate the anaesthesia machine

Radiography Equipment

A portable x-ray machine is required as well as plates and a developing unit (preferably automatic). The ideal option would be a digital unit as this would increase flexibility and remove the need for expensive developing chemicals and the maintenance associated with this. A portable unit would be ideal as it would allow field use as well as being smaller and thus cheaper to ship to Indonesia. There are no veterinary clinics in North Sulawesi we can refer to for X-rays and the hospitals do not accept animal patients.

Basic Haematology Unit

There are no facilities for veterinary labs in SULUT and the only possibility in Jakarta is 3hr flight from our project.

Mc Master chamber

Used for fecal examinations, to be able to count the eggs precisely and assess parasitical infestation.

Surgical instruments / Material

- Hemostat forceps (small & medium)
- Scalpel handel size 3 & 4
- Metzenbaum scissors
- Allis forceps
- Mouth gag for small animals
- Suction machine
- Laryngoscope
- Large dog scale

Sterilization/cleaning products

- Betadine scrub
- Hibi scrub
- Detergent for surgical instruments liquid or powder (ex. medizime)
- Trigene surface disinfectant

- Disinfectant tablets (to dissolve in water and disinfect instruments/surfaces)
- Clipper blade cleaning products (aerosol/oil)

Chemical restraint agents

- Dormitor (Medetomidine Hydrochloride) Zoletil, Ketamine, ACP, Xylazine, Pentobarbital, Atropine all difficult to obtain in Sulawesi.
- Reverzine (yohimbine)
- Oral chemical restraint agents

Anti-parasitic drugs

- External parasite spray for birds (Exner petguard)
- Bird deworming products
- Panacur
- Droncit
- Ivermectin oral or pour-on
- PRAZIQUANTEL (stand alone not mixed with other agents)
- Dronta
- Any broad spectrum de-worm treatment
- Any (topical) flea/external parassites treatment

Antibiotics

Expired antibiotics can increase in strength and are dangerous to use so it is essential that we get a **new supply** of antibiotics to treat problems such as bumblefoot in the birds or wounds in macaques and other primates.

Examples include:

- Doxycycline Injectable and oral
- Clindamicyne (oral solution)

Tetanus vaccine

Difficult or almost impossible to obtain locally. We use human tetanus vaccine (e.g. fort dodge) on the primates and currently out-of-stock.

Tuberculine skin test (MOT)

TB testing results are considered unreliable on primates if only using one method. With **Statpack test from ChemBio for primates** we will be able to determine with more accuracy whether the infection is present or not.

ELISa test kits for Psittacosis

Used to identify parrot fever

Other drugs

Examples include:

- Fluids (RL, glucose, sodium chloride)
- Metacam injection/Oral
- Cetacaine local anesthetic for reptiles
- F10 disinfectant for reptiles
- Critical care food for birds/reptiles
- Doxapram

- Vitamin C
- Multivitamines
- Miconazole anifungal for reptiles
- Nutrigel
- Nutrical paste
- Lacri Lube
- etc

Miscellaneous

Lorikeet Nectar Mix and Parrot grade bird seeds, sunflower seeds

Some of our psittacines depend on bird seed to get adequate nutrition and it is also used for enrichments. We cannot obtain this locally.

Bird rings

For identifying range of birds (small lories, medium-large cockatoos, etc) - If you can obtain any of these we will let you know the quantities of different sizes we require. We have a potential supplier for these in Europe, but as yet no budget to buy them

"Pig Nipple" Drinkers

"Pig nipple" drinkers, are waterpipe taps for animals similar to human drinking fountains, but operated by tongue. these will enable a variety of wildlife to have access to fresh water without the need to constantly clean and refresh their water bowls.

Infra-red light

infra red light is a very useful instruments when taking care of critical ill individuals to keep thei temparature up and stable.

Blood warmer and infusion warmer

A blood warmer is used to warm blood or fluids prior to transfusion to a patient. Often used in emergency settings, operating rooms, and intensive care units to prevent hypothermia, the instrument warms blood to a temperature that is safe for infusion

Other

- Needles size 21G (1/2")
- Needles size 23G (1/2")
- Needles size 25G (1/2")
- Catheters for BIRDS (small gauge 25G or smaller)
- Vicryl <u>absorbable 2-0/3-0 cutting edge</u>
- microtubes to take different kind of samples (without any additives)
- VetWrap bandaging tape (pref. dark colours)
- Scalpel blades size 10
- Custom Restraint material for raptors/ratites (i.e hood)
- crop feeders of different sizes (lories cockatoos)
- Surgical gloves sizes S/M (preferable latex examination or Triflex)
- Jumbo swabs
- Heavy duty welding gloves (to use for restraint purposes)
- Sterile and non-sterile swabs local supply of these are poor to non-existent
- Sterile and non sterile drapes
- Micro pore tape
- pipettes for lab work

Note:

We can legally import all of the above items. The process to get the approval documentation for customs can take at least a week, so please provide us with a full list of your donations as soon as possible so we can arrange the permits before your arrival. Some airlines also waive the excess baggage fee if you contact them in advance to register your luggage as donation for charity.
