

## New Scout Patrol Monthly Plan

This is a plan for meeting all the requirements for Scout through First Class rank in one year. It covers all skills instruction portions of the meetings and some of the patrol time activities.

This is a template that should be adjusted as necessary. For example, Scouts may not crossover in February, so the calendar can be adjusted down so it starts in April or May.

March	<p><b>Individually:</b> S6 with a parent, read <b>Adventure Ahead</b> chapter in Scout Handbook preparing for <b>S1, S2, S3</b>.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1:</b> Scout orientation with Scoutmaster. Learn <b>3a, 2a-d</b>. Practice <b>S1a-f</b>.  <b>Meeting 2:</b> <b>S3b</b> - Create patrol name, emblem, yell, and flag design. Practice <b>S1a-f, 2a-d, 3a</b>.  <b>Meeting 3:</b> Discuss upcoming campout, packing list, and duty roster.</p> <p><b>Swampfox Camporee</b></p>
April	<p><b>Individually:</b> <b>FC10</b> - tell a girl about scouts. <b>TF4d</b> – Assemble a personal first aid kit. <b>S7</b> - Schedule a Scoutmaster conference for Scout rank.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1:</b> Test <b>S1a-f, 2a-d, 3a-b</b> with ASM. <b>TF6a</b>- Record first attempt for TF6b (cannot sign off for 6b). <b>TF4d</b> - Bring a first aid kit that you assumed, discuss each item.  <b>Meeting 2:</b> Finish patrol flag and yell. <b>SC2e</b> - Create patrol menu using USDA nutritional model. Explain the importance of good nutrition (cannot sign off 2e at the meeting)  <b>Meeting 3:</b> <b>S4ab, TF3a-c, TF8</b> – EDGE method and knots.</p> <p><b>New Scout Campout:</b> Complete a number of requirements, Totin’ Chip, Fireman Chit.  <b>Service Project:</b> <b>TF7b</b> - Complete 1-hour service project for the church (could be done during meeting time).</p>
May	<p><b>Individually:</b> <b>FC10</b> - tell a girl about scouts. <b>S7</b> - Schedule a Scoutmaster conference for Scout rank.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1:</b> <b>S5</b> – Knife safety, <b>TF4abc</b> – First aid.  <b>Meeting 2:</b> <b>TF6b</b> - Bring month-long fitness tracking. <b>TF6c</b> – show improvement to fitness.  <b>Meeting 3:</b> <b>TF5abc</b> - Hiking safety (cannot sign off on part 5a during a meeting).  <b>Meeting 4:</b> <b>TF7a, SC8b</b> – Flags.</p> <p><b>Monthly Campout:</b> Do <b>FC2c-e</b> - (1 scout per campout) - use <a href="#">This worksheet</a>. In patrols of 6 or more scouts, you <i>could</i> break into two groups so a different scout could serve as cook for each.</p> <p><b>Advancement Academy:</b> Complete a number of SC and FC requirements.</p>
June	<p><b>Individually:</b> Do <b>FC10</b> - tell a girl about scouts. Do <b>SC7a-b</b> - physically active for 4 weeks. <b>TF9, TF10</b> - schedule a Scoutmaster conference for Tenderfoot. <b>TF11</b> – Board of Review.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1:</b> <b>SC2fg</b> – Sheet bend and bowline knots.  <b>Meeting 2:</b> <b>SC5abcd, FC6a</b> – Offsite swim test.  <b>Meeting 3:</b> <b>SC6abcde</b> – First aid.</p>

	<p><b>Monthly Campout: SC3abcd, 4</b> - 5-mile navigation hike. Do <b>FC2c-e</b> - (1 scout per campout) - use <a href="#">This worksheet</a>.</p>
July	<p><b>Individually:</b> Do <b>SC7a-b, FC8a-b</b> - physically active for 4 weeks. Do <b>SC1a</b> - participate in 5 outings. Do <b>SC8c-d</b> - earn money.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1:</b> Plan a 2-hour service project as a patrol activity; how does this relate to the Scout Oath. Research a person who fits FC9a requirements; ask him/her to speak at a meeting in September.</p> <p><b>Meeting 2: SC7c</b> - drug and alcohol program.</p> <p><b>Meeting 3: SC9ab</b> – Three Rs of safety; bullying.</p> <p><b>Summer Camp:</b> Complete leftover TF and SC requirements. Work on merit badges.</p> <p><b>Patrol Service Project: SC8e</b> - 2 hours</p>
August	<p><b>Individually:</b> Do <b>SC7a-b, FC8a-b</b> - physically active for 4 weeks. Do <b>SC1a</b> - participate in 5 outings. Do <b>SC8c-d</b> - earn money. Do <b>F9bc</b> - environmental issue, reduce garbage.</p> <p><b>Meeting 1: FC9a</b> – Councilperson to speak at a meeting. FC9bc – Homework.</p> <p><b>Meeting 2: FC9bc</b> – Present environmental issues, trash results.</p> <p><b>AOL Campout</b></p> <p><b>Service Project:</b> Do <b>SC8e, FC9d</b> - 3 hour service</p>
