\*Confirm with your fellow where the chalk talks, grand rounds and multi-disciplinary ILD rounds are located (usually ECOB 1st floor).

\*\*You will have your clinic one full day of continuity clinic per 2-week block. **Please check amion.com to verify your clinic schedule.**

\*\*\*Attend Jacobs afternoon report if attending rounds allows – check with your chief resident for locations.

## ***Required Consult Responsibilities***

-You will complete consults along with the primary pulmonary fellow on call.

-Please page the fellow on service (listed under [webpaging.ucsd.edu](http://webpaging.ucsd.edu)) prior to starting your rotation.

-You will follow patients that will be assigned to you by the fellow/attending. You may be responsible for a variety of procedures under supervision.

### ***Resident Continuity Clinic***

During this rotation, you will attend your continuity clinic ONCE according to your schedule.

### ***Graduation requirements***

Consider completing short observed physical exams (CEX) with your attending to complete the requirement.

Consider presenting an EBM to your team.

### ***Required Conferences***

#### **Mandatory Educational Conferences:**

1. Internal Medicine Grand Rounds – Wednesdays 12:00-1:00pm
2. Pulmonary Grand Rounds – Thursdays, 7:30-9:00, ECOB 1st floor conference room.

### ***Evaluations***

A house officer is evaluated at the end of the rotation via MedHub on-line evaluation system. Attending physicians are asked to provide both global and specific assessments of a house officer's performance within the structure of the six core competencies of the ACGME. In addition, the attending physician is instructed to review these Goals and Objectives with the house officer at the beginning of the rotation, and to discuss the house officer's performance with him or her near the end of the rotation. House officers are strongly encouraged to solicit this feedback from their attending physicians.
