Introduction

Introduction should explain about the situation, epidemiology, and background regarding why the research was done.

Introduction should be ended with the aim of the study conducted. Tables and Figures **should not** be placed in introduction section.

Every statements must be **citated with VANCOUVER SUPERScript style**.

Methods

Methods should explain about the methodology, sampling methods, and statistical analysis clearly. If live subjects were used, **author must type the numbers of ethical approval from the Ethical Committee**.

Results

Results should be presented in combination of texts, Tables, or Charts. Tables should be **placed in accordingly after the text**.

Tables, Charts and Figures **must be titled and numbered** accordingly and in sequence.

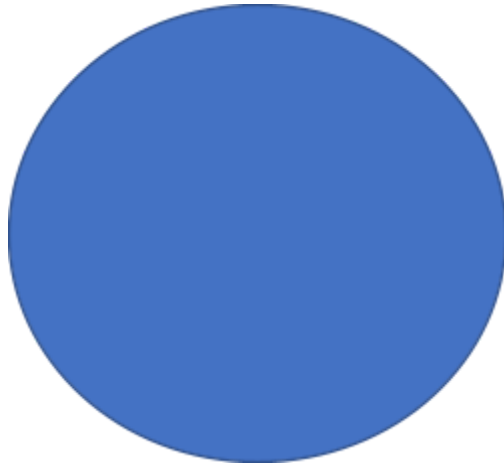


Figure 1. The title of the figure/chart should be beneath and centered

Discussion

Discussion should explain about the results and their comparison to the other recent studies **(references should NOT exceed 10 years prior to the year of this study. Exceptional can be given for rare cases, rare diseases, or rare conditions. Any reference aged more than 10 years prior must be only 5 references at maximum).**

Tables and Figures should **not** be placed in the discussion section.

Discussion should also explain the limitation of the study and further study needed (if necessary).

Conclusions

Conclusion should mention the summary of the study.

Conflict of interest

Author(s) should declare any conflict of interest if there is any.

Acknowledgement

Author(s) should state acknowledgement to any funding or any organization/company/etc that contributed to the study
