 - TC Loop Report - Rachel Gorden Mercer (RRE) **Rachel has rec'd emails thanking MMEA for the work they do.**
 - TC Central - Interim Natalia Romero Arbalaez: **has sent some emails and not received a response. Question about AS Auditions: Why is the timing 12N for the audition deadline. JGN: At the last minute directors have problems no matter the time whether that is midnight or 12N. We have resolved some challenges by allowing Directors to input their students and upload as auditions as they are ready, rather than having to do it all at once, and they can pay when they are finished. Having the deadline at noon allows staff in the morning to support teachers. We encourage teachers to think about the deadline as midnight of the day before so if they have challenges there is still time to fix them. Andy D., some additional communication around that will be helpful. Also, as a note, teachers should plan more time than**

Reached out, but no one emailed back. Plans to invite people to the choir open forum for more discussion. JGN: encourage people to talk to MMEA about MMEA things. This allows for more timely answers. It is expensive, but is underpriced for what we offer. Camp is expensive to run and we are asking people to basically work as volunteers for a whole week. Currently giving scholarships at nearly 100% of requests to help with the costs. When camp was \$500 for a full week we were bleeding money. It is still not budget neutral but is getting closer. We offer a lot of value.

- **Retired Members (Scott Rabehl - no report as SR is a new appointment) Glad to join and help as able.**
- **Community - vacancy**
- **MSHSL (Mark Gitch) Highschool league. 2 presentations at MWC. Been doing presentations with various groups. Band/Orch/Choir all participated in process revisions. Revising documents on rules/policy for contests. Adjudication forms will be reviewed next. Hoping to have it in place by the end of May for the next year.**

- **Equity Action Team (David Davis) DD: Equity team had a mtg. Of 30 on team 4 showed up. Wondering about task force documents - he is on some of the lists but has not been invited to the meetings - are they still operating? Budget Cuts in all schools are a big topic. What direction do we want the equity team to take action towards this issue? All State: wondering how does it align with our mission and values?**
JGN: there are aspects of the AS program addressed for equity and access. Added repertoire requirements. Asked musicians that are more equitably represented over the state. Plus scholarships allow for access. Is it the most effective or efficient way to follow the mission? Strike a balance between not making new programs that further the pitfalls that we see on how AS was designed in the past and the new MMEA programs. When we are ready to renovate, then changes can be implemented.

Chris: CR: pay close attention to what we are doing and what you are hearing when we get to MWC. There are things we need to address including turnover. We need some more consistency in leadership to make things more fruitful for the organization. Pretty confident we have good people in this space. After MWC he would like a deep dive into what is working well - what do we need to change. We want to make this space rewarding for all participants. Explore ways to make the financial burden lighter and the lifting easier.

Working to eliminate inconsistencies and inaccuracies. At this time it feels more cohesive. At this time Andy does not feel it is ticking all of the boxes for connection to MMEA’s mission. We have had this model for a long time and it has stayed the same for the most part. The task force is thinking “What can we do with our current budget and staffing to make AS improve in one thing this year.” It is a slow process. There has been some forward movement. To get to the mission a refresh will be needed. With a small handful of people we cannot make change, but if we have directors across the state to work with improvements, then we can make change. The increased costs of changing also need to be considered. There are regions in the state that do not send auditions. This is a telling indicator of perhaps in what areas we are not meeting needs. There are some meaningful things happening, but bigger changes need to happen. Chris: may know someone that would be willing to help with funding. Please pay attention to people and ask them their opinions etc. <p>David D: Taking some courses in making systemic change in organization. The common theme is dialogue people work community relationships. If we only focus on tasks then movement cannot happen. The money is focused on the tasks. 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board in person to build more community relationships. Put more emphasis on the human piece.

Andy: Finds frustrating that the people that say this needs to change/happen and then only 4 people apply for a board position across the state. He is asking people to be on the board and they are not putting their names in. Everyone he talks to at conventions he invites to join the board. It is work - we all have families performance and teaching, but it is finding ways of making it doable and sustainable.

There is a reputation of this board that it chews people up and spits them out.

Still looking for some AS judges, tenor/ bass, percussion/flutes/sax. \$5.50 per audition. Time commitment on average: typically Andy spends 10 -15 minutes on each audition. Rubrics this year provide more structure. Window of time for the judges to complete the full task - approx. 3 plus weeks.

Natalia: It is a lot. But what is most helpful is to do it in small chunks so that the comments are meaningful. She uses the comments for the next year to help her students with auditions. It takes about 15 auditions to really cement the rubric. I find it helpful with students when judges provide encouragement to students in their documentations. **MGitch:** Great way to start - pick 6 - listen to them and start to get a frame for yourself before you start scoring. **AD:** would like the judges to have some practice files to listen to before they begin judging. **JGN:** this year judges are required to attend training with Jordan. We have some really solid judges. But a few that are unnecessarily harsh and then we do not ask them back. **AL:** Judging is a good introduction to board service. We keep a list of judges so even if not asked this time could be asked next time. **Behavior Policy Work** headed by Nicole and feedback from the AS task force. More comprehensive framework and responses to take in the context of an event happening. Still updating that for this year. If you have questions about AS Andy is willing to help with those conversations.

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- **Middle/Secondary Classroom:** (This link in the Agenda did not work) Aaron Lohmeyer DMMH :**Open many interesting submissions. Take some time and listen to the responses and the work the students are doing? CR: Seeing what students put together is great. Cool concept. JGN: Could move this to video format so we can share it more easily as we move forward. AL Re: budget - We are paying a clinician for this program and it is not currently budget neutral. This work could continue without a guest artist - please consider how this ought to fit in MMEA in the future. JGN: No new programs are budget neutral in the first year. You should feel really good about how this is shaping up and all of the entrants you have. CR: would like to talk about this with Aaron more offline. Chris thinks it should be blown up even more. Good new direction.**
- **Middle/Secondary Ensemble+:** Eric Songer **JGN: Mid Sec ensemble: full PLUG set up for MWC. Nick Gaudette, Edina is doing work in the area and helping out. We will likely shut down the office during MWC to go see his session Coacello! He is doing work with Eric Songer and the PLUG. As a board please remember to advocate for all programs.**
- **Elementary** - Michael Bjork **MB: One hope for elementary world is to think more holistically. Working to be more innovative in approach.**

As first year as Elem VP at convention hoping to spark those conversations. Elem AS choir has 253 students this year. Excited for that. JGN: Cap at 200 grades 4/5/6 160 students year 1, 180 year 2 (dropped 6th graders for this year) and then altered it and the count for more inclusion. The director was open to more students. What a joyful problem to have. MB If you know elementary people that are excited to try new things - send them to me. Elem music can break from the silo and the learning can be large- starting in elem - 12th grade.

- **Fundraising Report** -Aaron Lohmeyer **AL: fundraising: generating excitement and buzz for the work we are doing. Take a step back and realize that we are doing a lot of**

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lifting already. With MWC we are pushing the energy out and people already are excited about that.

We are looking at working with exhibitors to make sure they feel appreciated and that they understand the other ways their brand or organization can support MMEA and be SEEN. Check the bottom of the document to see all of the ways people can participate. This is the group lift. JGN: Exhibitors - thank them for being there, introduce yourself as a board member. If you see there is a business missing - reach out to them, say you missed them and tell them you would love to see them at MWC 2027.

Casey: Add an invitation to the host script for each person to visit the exhibit hall.
