

Sometimes a noun is more than just one word.... It is a whole phrase. See the examples below:

-The box..... (was full)

-The big box..... (was full)

-The big green box..... (was full)

-The big green box of shoes..... (was full)

-The big green box of shoes that I found yesterday..... (was full)

-The big green box of shoes that I found yesterday in the closet(was full)

-The big green box of shoes that I found yesterday in the closet and that was heavy..... (was full).

Nouns can get lengthy when we add adjectives (describing words) or when we add "that", "where", and "which" phrases to describe more about them. See if you can find the lengthy noun phrases in each sentence below.

1. Clara Barton was born in 1821 in Oxford, Massachusetts. She became a teacher, worked in the U.S. Patent Office and was an independent nurse during the Civil War. ***While visiting Europe, she worked with a relief organization known as the International Red Cross and lobbied for an American branch when she returned home***.
